I believe that you have been in correspondence with Mr. Neal Harlow, Librarian of the University of British Columbia, in Vancouver, and that you know that he is anxious to secure official publications of the Japanese Government on an exchange basis.


The National Library of Canada has the privilege of nominating libraries in other countries that may receive the official publications of the Government of Canada, and we also have authority to nominate a Canadian library - other than the National Library itself - to which publications sent in exchange may be forwarded.

I believe that the National Diet Library is already receiving the publications of the Government of Canada, and I shall be glad if, in exchange, you will send the publications of the Government of Japan to the Library of the University of British Columbia.

It will be quite agreeable to me if the details of this exchange arrangement are worked out between Mr. Harlow and yourself. When you have concluded an agreement, I shall be glad to receive details, so that it may be officially on record.
