At Work on Trail Smelter.

The work of renovating the Trail smelter progresses rapidly and it is expected by the management that the furnaces will be blown in on or about July 1, when ore to the extent of about 4000 tons will be on hand. The process of roasting ore will commence in a few days. The smelter company has con-tracts for the purchase of ore from the War Eagle, Cliff and Center Star companies.

The construction of the lead stack is being vigorously conducted. The new copper blast furnaces are also being built but if they are not in readiness by July 1, smelting will be commenced in the furnaces used by the British Columbia Smelting and Refining company, the former owners of the smelter. Superintendent Aldridge is said to have unlimited authority from his company in the management of the smelter. He is making large purchases of machinery and supplies and is placing orders wherever he can obtain the best material, though his aim is to do most of his buying in Canada.

Can't Yield Now.

London, May 3.-It is announced in a special dispatch from Madrid that there is no idea of surrender either in ministerial circles or among the popu lace. On the contrary, it is added, the war is to be pursued with greater vigor. The special dispatch adds that it is stated at Madrid, by those responsible for naval movements, that it has been determined to avoid isolated combats on equal terms with the superior enemy and that they now intend to throw the whole united strength of Spain into one supreme effort to crush the American squadron in Cuban waters. The dispatch says:

"Until an engagement is fought no proposal for intervention will be listened to."

Dispatches from Rome say the queen telegraphed the pope she had resolved to resist to the bitter end.

Sagasta will inform the cortes on behalf of the queen regent of Spain's intentions to continue the war.

A New Regiment.

It has been decided by the Departnent of Malitia to allow the organization of a new regiment in Canada, which will be known as the Rocky Mountain Rifles, and which will more particularly belong to British Columbia. The proposed regiment will consist of siz companies, one each at Nelson, Rossland, Revelstoke and Vernon and Fort Steele. The companies at Vernon and Fort Steele will be mounted the others ordinary rifles. The regiment will be a special corps of artillery armed in a special way and having a special uniform.

Spain's Auxiliary Cruisers.

All the information obtainable concerning the Spanish force of auxiliary cruisers in regard to which vague ports have emanated from Madrid. tends to show that it has been overestimated. The best two ships, the Columbia and the Normannia, formerly of the Hamburg-American line, are yet unarmed, and it is believed they will be unable to secure armament.

The chief factor of the remainder of the Spanish force of auxiliary cruisers consist in the six steamers belonging to the Barcelona Trans-Atlantic Steamship company. They are fairly wel armed, but they have been scattered Two of them are with the Cape Verde squadron, as transports, one is convoying the torpedo flotilla, another, it is said, is at Santiago de Cuba and two are at Cadiz.

Fire at Northport.

Northport, May 2 .- Fire broke out at 4 a. m. to-day in a barber shop on Fourth avenue. It spread rapidly and burned about four hours, destroying more than 40 buildings with much of heir contents. Of the entire business listrict but two buildings remain—the Spokane Falls and Northern depot and the brick store building of A. T. Kendrick & Co. But little insurance was carried, owing to the high rate. Many are homeless.

Two circumstances contributed to make the destruction great-the presence of a high wind and the lack of a water system. Every effort was made to check the spread of the fire, but it was not until the blowing up of buildings in the path of the fire began that its spread was stopped.



A tunnel is being driven on this vein from which ore is being taken. On the same property is a larger vein (quartz) carrying galena and pyrites.

The "G. A. R." has a 30-foot shaft sunk on a 2-foot vein, heavily mineralized with an intimate mixture of iron and copper pyrites, galena, blende and silverglance. The finest pieces of wire sil $ver found \ on Boundary Creek \ were \ taken$ from this shaft. The "Fred D," was located in De cember, 1895, more as ground for a basis for mining operations for the other claims than for its present value. although there is little doubt that the large vein on the O. B. runs through it. There is a small vein of galena on this claim.
