EVERY LOCAL VOTED TO LOBBY THE CLC TO HAVE AUCE ACCEPTED. AS AN AFFILIATE - NOW THE WORK BEGINS!

First, the question on the ballot asked:

Do you want AUCE to attempt to affiliate with the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC) by:

Lobbying the CLC affiliates to have the decision to exclude AUCE reversed ?

Merging with a CLC union? -

Abstain? -

2,643 ballots went out to the membership and were counted on Friday night, January 16, 1981, by a group of 23 AUCE members whose names appear elsewhere on this bulletin.

** Headquarters members are, according to the AUCE Provincial Constitution, Section 4, MEMBERSHIP, C:
"Where no Local Association has been chartered, employees may join as Headquarters Members of the Provincial Association. The Provincial Association shall assist such members in joining or forming a Local Association as soon as possible thereafter. Applications for Headquarters Members shall be made to the Provincial Executive. Dues for Headquarters Members shall be equal to the Per Capita Tax as set forth in Section 15 A., ..."

Protest regulations, unfair ballot, as explained in the Constitution:

Section 9: PROVINCIAL REFERENDUMS AND VOTING PROCEDURES, Section 8:

"Results of the balloting will be circulated to the Local Associations by the Provincial Trustees within seven (7) days of the results of the counting. Any protest alleging 'unfair ballot' or other irregularity, must be presented in writing to one of the Provincial Executive Officers within fourteen (14) days of the mailing from Provincial Headquarters of the results of the ballot in the Provincial Newsletter. Upon receipt of such notice, the Provincial Executive shall meet, and if the protest is upheld, another ballot shall be conducted."

So, what do the results mean now, you ask?

Well, the Provincial Executive considers that the membership has overwhelmingly decided that we should affiliate with the Canadian Labour Congress, as AUCE, with our Constitution and By-Laws the way they are - in other words - 'intact as AUCE'.

The June 1980 Convention made the Provincial Executive responsible for negotiating the terms of affiliation with the CLC, if the membership voted to go in that direction. We consider that the results of the ballots give the Provincial Executive the mandate to negotiate AUCE's terms of affiliation, and to lobby the other CLC affiliates in order to convince the CLC of the AUCE membership's wish to affiliate intact as AUCE.

What the Executive plans to do in the next month or so, is meet, plan our lobby activities, inform the CLC of the results of our referendum ballots and report back to the membership on a regular basis of what affiliation/lobby business transpires, through the Local Reps to the Provincial Executive, and through newsletters and/or bulletins. We expect that this might be a lengthy process and please note that any final ratification of the affiliation negotiations must be approved by the AUCE membership - so you will be kept informed and you will have the chance to vote, however long the process might take.
