As many of the remaining issues are cost items and therefore will have a bearing on the total cost picture and as all of the issues can only be considered in relation to the total agreement, the University does not believe it would be fruitful or useful to continue with negotiations in the normal way. It is suggested however, that it might be worthwhile to have a subcommittee of say two or three of your main committee, meet with Mr. Burian at convenient times to explore possible avenues of approach and to find out more explicitly the reasons for disagreement. Mr. Burian is well informed on the matters involved and possibly could be of real help in expediting the resolution of the contract. As the University is also presently involved in negotiations of the agreement with the Registered Nurses Association, certain rearrangements will have to be made if you accept this suggestion.
