I would be pleased if you will proceed to Kitselas and have all Government property in the lock-up there packed up and shipped to this office. There will probably be some that will not be worth shipping. I am enclosing a list of property that was there on May 31st, last, also a letter from the Superintendent.

Kindly return these with your report.

I am also enclosing a letter received from Mrs. Bowan of Prince Rupert in which she states her house at Terrace has been broken into. I am also enclosing a letter from Mrs. Kirkaldy of Terrace in which she complains of her neighbors pigs, etc, running over her property, this complaint is rather ancient, but I would like you to stop off at Terrace, and see what there is to these complaints, and any other police matters that may be brought to your attention while in that part of the District.

It will be advisable to carry your poll tax receipts along with you as none have been collected East of Haysport excepting from the G.T.P. Employees, which were deducted from their pay cheques at Smithers.
