
FRASER RIVER BUOYS.

Copy of a Report of a Committee of the Honourable the Executive Council, approved by His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor the 16th May, 1885.

The Committee of Council beg to draw the attention of the Dominion Government to the ever-recurring complaints with regard to the neglect of the Fraser River. The buoys at the mouth of that important stream are reported to be continually out of place, thus rendering navigation unnecessarily difficult and dangerous.

The Committee would earnestly urge upon the Dominion Government the great need that exists for a more vigilant supervision of these buoys, and would suggest that the channel should be frequently examined and the position of the buoys tested, and re-located when necessary.

The Committee would also point out that the Snag Boat, which might be usefully employed in the above duties as well as in removing snags, has been lying idle for several months.

The Committee advise that a copy of this Minute, if approved, be forwarded to the Honourable the Secretary of State for Canada.
