INTRODUCTION

The Liquor Control Board presents the Thirty-first Annual Report, covering operations from April 1st, 1951, to March 31st, 1952.

STAFF

The Board acknowledges with pleasure the co-operation and loyalty of the various members of the staff throughout the Province during the year under review. The total number of employees on the permanent staff of the Liquor Control Board as at March 31st, 1952, was 355 males and 22 females.

GOVERNMENT LIQUOR STORES

During the period under review one new Government Liquor Store was opened at Gibsons Landing on June 1st, 1951.

STOCKS

The value of stocks as at March 31st, 1952, amounted to \$5,630,794.19, being a decrease of \$63,692.42 in the value of the stocks as at March 31st, 1951.

SALES

The total sales of \$66,231,401.41 show an increase over the previous fiscal year of \$5,655,687.02. For comparative purposes, classification of sales is given hereunder for the fiscal years ended March 31st, 1951, and March 31st, 1952.

DUTY, EXCISE, AND SALES TAX

The duty, excise, and sales tax paid to the Federal Government for the period under review amounted to \$12,493,594.04, the details of which are as follows, and for convenience a comparison is shown with the duty, excise, and sales tax paid to the Federal Government during the fiscal year immediately preceding the period under review:—

The figures quoted do not represent the total duty, excise, and sales tax on merchandise sold during the period under review, but only that paid by the Liquor Control Board on goods that were cleared through the Customs and Excise Departments during the said period.

The above total does not include taxes paid direct to the Federal Government by Canadian breweries, by Canadian wineries, and by Canadian distilleries on liquor purchased by the Board duty paid.

PERMITS

The detailed statement showing the sale of each variety of permit sold is shown in Appendix C.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 115 of the "Government Liquor Act," the revenue derived from the sale of permits was transmitted to the Honourable the Minister of Finance, to be accounted for as part of the general revenue of the Province, and amounted to \$18,701, being an increase of \$2,609.25 over the previous fiscal year.

INTERDICTION

Three hundred and sixty-seven orders of interdiction were made pursuant to the provisions of section 67 of the "Government Liquor Act."

Three hundred and eighty-two orders of revocation of orders of interdiction were made pursuant to section 69 of the "Government Liquor Act."

PENALTIES AND PROCEDURE

Appendix B, Law Enforcement, shows in detail all prosecutions reported to the Board under section 121 of the "Government Liquor Act." Destruction of liquor forfeited to the Crown and held by the Liquor Control Board was authorized by Orders in Council as follows: Order in Council No. 905, approved April 24th, 1951; Order in Council No. 1,114, approved May 15th, 1951; Order in Council No. 2,255, approved September 24th, 1951; and Order in Council No. 735, approved March 28th, 1952.

Under the "Government Liquor Act Amendment Act, 1951," which amends sections 78 and 79, the Attorney-General directed that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police dispose of liquor seized and forfeited to the Crown according to the Act.

Improvement in the existing hotels has continued throughout the Province, both to the hotels proper and licensed premises. Also during the year a total of \$632,000 was expended on the erection and equipment of four new hotels, and the sum of \$2,319,870.60 on improvements to existing hotels. Since the inception of the Board's policy, commenced in 1947, when the Act was amended (giving authority to require proper hotel accommodation), a total of \$4,625,500 has been expended on new hotels, and the sum of \$12,718,546.83 has been expended on the existing hotels for improvements, making a total expenditure of \$17,344,046.82 in providing better accommodation for the general public.

The general over-all picture in connection with licensed premises appears to be satisfactory.

There has been considerable difficulty experienced in connection with minors endeavouring to obtain admittance to licensed premises. Every co-operation has been received from the licensees concerned in this regard, and every endeavour has been made to eliminate this objectionable practice by juveniles.

The Inspection Department has enjoyed the full co-operation of holders of all licences and also other Government departments and law-enforcement agencies.
