

I beg to acknowledge receipt of Wing Sang & Company's cheque, value \$500.00, being head tax on Lee Dy Sing, eleven years old Chinese girl now resident in China, who desires to come to Canada to attend school.

Enclosed will be found temporary receipt No. 1550 covering payment of head tax in this case. Please send the same to the girl in China, together with a copy of this letter, which is furnished in duplicate, as the Steamship Agents will consider the same authority for issuing transportation to her upon payment for the same, and upon her arrival in this port she will be admitted if found to be physically and mentally fit.
