

Chinese Fined \$20 For Beating Bridge Gate

BRIGHOUSE, Nov. 16.—A fine of \$20 and costs was imposed in Richmond Police Court today on Chung Chuck of Lulu Island, who is charged with driving through a closed gate on Fraser avenue bridge after the bridge tender had closed it before opening the span.

According to evidence, Chung Chuck crossed the span while the bridge tender was walking from the south gate to close the northerly barrier. Instead of waiting for the bridge tender to return and permit him to drive on, the Chinese was alleged to have broken the lock, opened the gate and passed through, leaving the gate open and the open draw unguarded.
