### INFORMATION FOR PASSENGERS.

BREAKFAST from 8.30 until 10.00 a.m.

LUNCHEON at 1 p.m. AFTERNOON TEA at 4.30 p.m.

DINNER at 7 p.m.

Eastbound steamers gain one day when passing the 180th Meridian, which is called "Antipodes Day."

Westbound steamers drop one day when passing the 180th Meridian.

**Mail and Telegrams.**—On arrival at Victoria please call at Information Bureau for mail and telegrams, also be sure to enquire before leaving ship at Vancouver.

**Passengers are cordially invited to make our offices their headquarters and to have their mail and telegrams addressed in our care.**

Passengers should leave their addresses so that Mail received after their departure can be forwarded.

**Wireless.**—Rates at which messages can be transmitted may be obtained from the Purser.

**Baggage on Steamer.**—Only handbags and trunks which will fit underneath the berths are allowed in state-rooms. All large or heavy baggage containing articles required during the voyage must be placed in the baggage-room, to which access may be obtained daily.

**Baggage Arrangements.**—Canadian Customs Officers, also Baggage Checkers, accompany the steamers from Victoria to Vancouver. This enables passengers to have baggage inspected and checked to destination, avoiding delay and inconvenience at Vancouver.

Hand Baggage will not be inspected on steamers, but on wharf at Vancouver. If requested, room stewards will carry hand baggage ashore and, after inspection, red cap porters will transfer it to train.

## Canadian Pacific Steamships, Limited

Trunks in stateroom should be sent to B deck for Canadian Customs inspection and/or railway checking. After inspection, trunks will remain in custody of Customs Officers until arrival at Vancouver.

All baggage will be placed in alphabetical order on B deck and wharf.

Baggage in ship's baggage room will be checked there.

Baggage for United States points need not be examined by Canadian Customs Officers, as it can be checked through Canada in bond, subject to United States Customs inspection at U.S. port of entry, or destination, provided Customs Officer is stationed there.

Baggage for European Points may be bonded through Canada, thus avoiding the necessity for examination by Canadian Customs Authorities.

All baggage will be placed in baggage room of Canadian Pacific Railway Station if not claimed immediately on arrival.

Passengers stopping over in Vancouver can leave baggage in bonded baggage room in the Canadian Pacific Railway Station, free of charge.

**Baggage cannot be checked until railway tickets have been procured.**

**Passenger List.**—Passengers wishing to forward a copy of this list to friends may obtain it on application at the Purser's office, together with envelope for mailing.

**Deck Chairs** can be rented for the voyage at a cost of \$1.

The Surgeon is authorized to make customary charges, subject to the approval of the Commander, for treating any passengers at their request for any illness not originating on board the ship. In the case of sickness contracted on board no charge will be made, and medicine will be provided free.

**Valuables.**—The Company will not be responsible for money, jewellery and other valuables of passengers. Passengers are advised not to keep such articles in their staterooms, but are recommended to hand them, sealed and marked with the owner's name, to the Purser for deposit in the safe, but as no charge is made the Company can accept no responsibility for loss or damage, however arising.

**Quarantine Inspection** by the Canadian Government Health Officer will take place on arrival at Quarantine Station, Williams Head.

## FOR PASSENGERS DISEMBARKING AT VANCOUVER.

**Immigration—Railway Tickets.**—Canadian and United States Immigration Officers, also Railway Ticket Agents, accompany steamers from Victoria to Vancouver for the purpose of immigration inspection, issuing tickets and exchanging orders to all points, making sleeping car, Trans-Atlantic and Trans-Pacific reservations. They will be located in the Dining Saloon.

**Table 1—Canadian Immigration.**—All passengers are required to pass the Canadian Immigration Officer at Table 1.

**Table 2—United States Immigration.**—All passengers destined to or passing through the United States will also be required to pass the United States Immigration Officer at Table 2.

**Table 3—Ticket Information and Routing.**—After passing immigration inspection, passengers who are proceeding beyond Vancouver will then apply for ticket information and routing authority at Table 3.

**Table 4—Sleeping Car Reservations** will be made at Table 4.

**Table 5—Railway Tickets** will be issued at Table 5.

**Table 6—Trans-Atlantic Reservations.**—For confirmation of and endorsement on your order, of accommodation requested through Orient Offices or accommodation desired, please apply to Table 6. Please give this your careful attention, otherwise accommodation cannot be held.

**Table 6—Trans-Pacific Return Reservations** to the Orient will be made at Table 6.

**Table 7—Foreign Exchange—Travellers' Checks—Merchandise Forwarded.**—For the convenience of passengers, a Representative of the Dominion Express Company meets all steamers on arrival at Victoria and accompanies them to Vancouver, for the purpose of cashing and issuing Travellers' Checks, cashing Letters of Credit, buying and selling foreign money, and forwarding of goods by freight or express service. Please call at Table 7.

**Table 8—Hotel Reservations** for Hotel Vancouver will be made at Table 8.

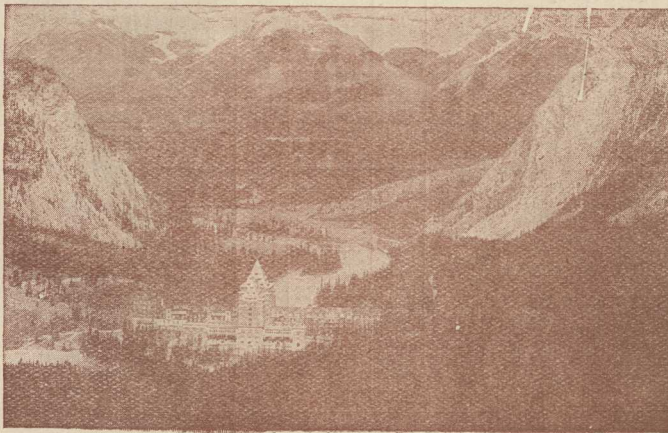

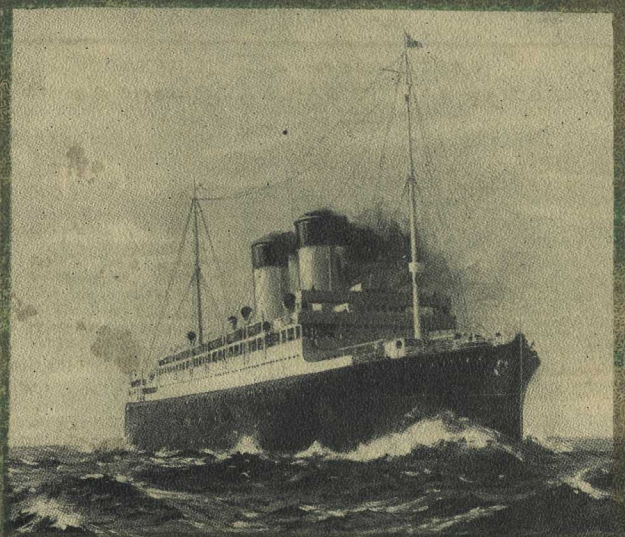
