The City Council is doing its best to get the co-operation of other cities concerned and procure a special act conferring upon this and other cities similarly situated the power to tax railway lands and improvements within the limits of their respective municipalities. If it obtains this it will add to the revenue possibly a couple of thousand dollars per annum, possibly more, possibly less. But to have the right of the city to the use of adjacent waters for industrial purposes confirmed will mean far more then this. It will mean the building of more concentrators and the enlargement of those that exist. One mine manager informed this paper that he would rather take the concentrator, which was mooted for his company, down to Sheep Creek Falls where there was no doubt about the water than to have it where there was such dubiety Another asked whether the WORLD thought his company would like to run into a lawsuit by building a concentrator. And there are dozens in the same position. John Houston of Nelson has taken the A ot under his wing and has declared more than once that the city has such a right. The World does not doubt John's word but it does say that those who oppose the industrial rights of the city to such water find legal opinion which confirms them in their interpretation of the Act and who are quite prepared for fight for such interpretation. So whether John Houston is right or not it still is patent that the Act is considered open to doubt by some. If concentrators are built here it means the employment of many more men in getting ore for them It means the opening of many mines. And all this means much more revenue to the city than can be got by going after the railroads. In fact their contribution would not be regarded as largely important in comparison with the other revenues accruing from such a policy as that here adumbrated. The City Council can act directly

### DO WITHOUT MORGAN KUROKI THE FIGHTER

Business Making Americans.

New York, April 18,-Advices received by the Oceanic last evening contain explanations of the current warfare which make the situation much clearer. It appears that the Cunard Line is making extensive arrangements for Continental as well as Mediterranean business. The Liverpool Daily Post of February 23d contains the following account of an important concession obtained from the Hungarian government by the Cunard company:

"It is reported that the Cunard company have obtained from the Hungarian government and importconcession with regard to carrying emigrant traffic from that country Japanese army who is more esteemto the United States.

By reason of the concession granted, it is stated that the Cunard Line have now a complete monopoly of the third-class emigrant traffic from Hungary to the United States, the emigrant agents there sending all such passengers by the Cunard steamers. The Cunard company, it is said, can please itself whether it gives to the German lines any of the business as the German lines cannot now book ing receipts and bills. Finder re Hungarian passengers.

The amount of the Cunard subsidy is thought to be about £20,000 a year and it is believed that four or five steamers will be placed on the Mediterranean service. From Hungary the emigration to the five pullets. Enquire at World United States is very large.

### SMELTER STARTS UP MATERIAL REDUCTIONS

ion Copper and Montreal & Boston

Greenwood, April 18.-While no definite announcement has been given out regarding any successful termination of the negotiations relating to the amalgamation of the D. minion Copper company with the Montreal & Boston company, it is confidently asserted by many that a satisfactory understanding has been arrived at, and that work will be resumed at the smelter and also at the Brooklyn and Stemwinder mines at an early date.

Private information from the east to parties in Greenwood and Boundary Falls convey the welcome assurance that work will begin at the lower smelter at the beginning of May, and that any ployes still resident at Boundary Fall will be able to resume their old occupations by that time.

With the exception of the Sunset, all the mines from which the Boundary Falls smelter drew their ore supply are evidently finding ample accommodation for their products elsewhere, so that in case the smelter resumes work, the management will have to look to other mines for a continuous ore supply. This can be secured from the Morrison in Deadwood camp as well as from the Dominion Copper company's properties in Phoenix, where ten thousand tons are on the dump awaiting shipment, and where thousands of tons are blocked out ready for the
