## MINES OF KOOTENAY

### Rossland and Boundary Shipments.

### LATEST RETURNS OF OUTPUT

What the Mines Are Doing Over the District—Rossland Doing Well.

Close on 100,000 tons of ore have been shipped by the Rossland mines up to last night, leaving five more shipping days in this month. This is rather better than the average of 8000 tons a week. Four years ago Rossland was booming and barely half this tonnage was being sent away. The War Eagle was a principal shipper, though shipping about what it does now. Today the Le Roi No. 2, what with the ore it is sending to Grand Forks, Greenwood and Northport, together with that it is putting through the small mill here, is a larger producer than the War Eagle and the value of the ore is considerably more.

### Boundary Shipments.

Phoenix, March 25.—Special.—With the two old standbys, the Granby and Mother Lode mines shipping their usual quota regularly to the local smelters, the Boundary mines so far this year have sent out about 200,000 tons of ore, the value of which is estimated to be not less than a million dollars. For the last week the following mines have contributed to the shipments of ore as follows:

Granby mines to Granby smelter 11,970 tons; Mother Lode to Greenwood smelter, 3,488 tons; Oro Denoro to Granby smelter, 924 tons; Emma, to Greenwood and Nelson smelters, 396 tons.

This week the Granby smelter treated 12,575 tons of ore; making total of 153,954 tons for the year.

## JAPANESE POINT OF VIEW NEWS IN A NUTSHELL

### Minister of Marine Is Satisfied with Campaign.

### URGENT NEED FOR A LARGER NAVY

#### Admits Work of Repairing Russian Ships Is Efficiently Conducted at Port Arthur.

Tokio, March 26—The House of Representatives today listened to a significant speech by Yamamoto, the Minister of Marine, and passed with enthusiasm and without a dissenting vote of thanks to Admiral Togo and his officers for their services to the country. When the vote was taken, the members of the house cheered the navy.

The Minister of Marine said since last October the Japanese navy had been under the necessity of increasing its strength, on account of the actions of Russia.

Continuing, he said it had been manifested to every observer that Russia had instantly increased her

strength in the Far East, and that of Japan had not purchased the cruisers Niashin and Kasuga from the Argentine Republic, her naval strength would have been below that of Russia. Referring to the result of the work of Admiral Togo and his fleet, he said the latest reports showed that the Russians had four battleships, five cruisers and ten torpedo boat destroyer afloat at this time from which it must be concluded that the work of repairing at Port Arthur was being carried forward efficiently.

The latest attack on Port Arthur had enabled the Japanese to observe the actual strength of the enemy there.

### A HIGH GRADE MINE MINES WILL RESUME

#### Defiance of Greenwood Equipped and Started to Work.

Greenwood, March 25—Wm. Fowler, of Providence repute, who has been spending the past few months among his old friends in Scotland, has recently returned to Greenwood to prosecute development on his latest acquisition, the Defiance.

Just before leaving last autumn he completed the purchase of this property and is planning to equip it with machinery this spring, and to speedily make a shipping mine of it. The grade of ore in the Defiance is very high and the location good.

In the hands of the very best, most experienced high grade ore man in this section great hopes are entertained for the future of the Defiance.

#### The Republic Mines

During last week the Republic mines shipped 28 cars of ore, distributed as follows: Mountain Lion 14 cars to Boundary Falls and Trail smelters; Knob Hill, 4 cars to Nelson smelter; Zala M., 2 cars to Granby smelter; Quilp, 300 tons to Tacoma smelter.

#### Nettie L. and Silver Cup Are Starting Up Next Week.

Ferguson, March 25—The long anticipated announcement has been made at last that work will be resumed on the Nettie L., and Silver Cup about April 1st, when a full force will be sent up to the mines.

Pending this date strenuous efforts are being made by a force of 95 men to complete the installation of the machinery at Five Mile, where is situated the 20-stamp mill and reduction plant, erected in conjunction by the two companies operating these mines. It is hoped to have the plant in working order not later than May 1st.

When both the mines and plant are in full operation a force between 200 and 230 men will be employed, making a substantial payroll for the town.

#### Parrish to Have Charge

The courts have ordered 100 feet of drifting to be done on the Slocan Star, to determine disputed points in the case brought against it by Johnnie Harris. Manager Parrish of the Le Roi, Rossland, will have charge of the work.

# Outside Camps

## BOUNDARY.

On the Dynamo the tunnel is now in about 125 feet.

The shaft of the Ladysmith, about a mile below Anasconda, is being pushed.

The work of driving the long tunnel on the Blue Jay is still being continued.

At the Fife lime quarries shipments to the Trail smelter are being made steadily.

A force of 100 men is now steadily employed at the Mother Lode mine in Deadwood camp.

George R. Caldwell, of Brandon, Man., has secured a judgment of \$9012 against the Golden Crown Mines, Ltd.

Roderick and McInnis are steadily working at the lengthening of the tunnel on the Summit claim, Summit camp.

Foreman Trevorrow is the sole employee at the Snowshoe mine. Water is beginning to come up pretty well in the deep working of this property.

The force of men at the Elkhorn mine, Providence camp, has been increased to 17, and the shipments continue to be at the rate of about 60 tons monthly.

It is reported that the final payment on the bond on the Gold Bug, taken over by Greenwood men a few months ago, has been made, and that the mine is looking well.

Work has been carried on all winter in the Dykehead claim, near Cascade, on the shore of Christina lake, and owned and worked by Kelly and Forsyth. It is said that the showing of copper ore is excellent and is improving with depth.

Ore from the Providence, one of the many high grade mines near Greenwood, is now being sent to the Trail smelter without sorting. The force of men now numbers between 35 and 40. During the winter the main shaft has been deepened from the 183 foot level.

## COAST

In February the Tyee mine shipped 5000 tons to Ladysmith and will maintain that rate.

The Marble Bay mines, on Texada Island, shipped 3414 tons to Crofton smelter.

The Van Anda group is gradually increasing its output to the Crofton smelter.

## LARDEAU

The owners of the Horsehoe, at Trout Lake, are busy sacking rich ore.

Ten more stamps are to be added to the Oyster-Criterion mill at Cambourne.

The Metropolitan Gold and Silver Mining company intend putting in an aerial tram at the Tritone mine, near Ferguson.

The Marie Marilla company intended resuming work on the Pedro and Minnie F claims in the Lardeau as soon as supplies can be got in.


