It seems to be the practice in
Rosemiand as elsewhere in the provinco, to hold an inquest or not just as the coroner feels like. Whether the law here, as in Great Britain and other portions of the Empire, insiats on the holding of an inquest onthe ocoasion of any sudden or uspioious death or not, it is cerhinly not the oustom in this province, and most certainly not in this oity. There have been more than die instance where no inquest has boon held. The coroner exeroises his judgment, and only holds an inquent when he sees fit. As long as the coroner is worthy of his potition this will work well enough, bat he is often onough placed in a vituation which demands much thoral courage, especially when, as is often the oase, he is a praotioing physioian. On this account ae well as on others it would be, perhaps, bettor, were an inquest necessary in overy case of sudden or suspicoun death, and let the jury decide the point whether the evidence presented was sufficient or whether it. ${ }^{2}$ as necessary
But when the enquiry-is held under the present systam it preWhpposes that the case is sufficienty grave for the taking of evidenco which will afterwards be produce man's lite is at stake or in some important damage suit, whereo the tissue depende the livelihood of a family which has lost its bread. unider oath. Pays Duble Freight Rate of Any Mining Camp in America

Nelson, April 28.-George Hus ton, of Sandon, is a guest at the Madden, and as he is well informed on the zino question his views on the matter of the freight rates on the motal and the development of the induatry in the slocan are worthy of consideration.
Mr. Hueton Baid: "In the first place the question of the cost of haulage of zinc ores has been well cheoked up and it is found that the Slooan country paya the highest froight rate on zinc ore of any country in the world. The rate from Sandon to Antwerp is $\$ 13$ per ton.
The next highest rate is paid by Loadville, Col., which is practioally $\$ 8$ per ton. The Slocan rate does not inolude the auction obarges, insurance, and other small items, which, if added to the \$13 rate, would bring the total up to $\$ 15.55$ per ton. The Leadville rate includes the oost of the several items montioned and, therefore, $\$ 15.55$ against $\$ 8$.

in the municipal squabble this week, says the Phoenix Pioneer, except hal Attorney General Wil-
son has written to City Clerk Matheson asking him to send the necessary declarations re the re-ignation of the entire membership of the oity council. After ten days have passed, or by next Monday, the deciarations will be forwarded when the attorney general will 3k probably take steps to order a new election.
It is doubtful, however, if six men can be secured to save the city
as aldermen till this trouble is cleared up, or until Chief of Police resign. The mayor states that * Chief Flood is still acting, and as Nightwatchman MoDougall is also
on shift in the city, there are plenty of so-called guardians of the peace Judge Williams still holds the fort, contrary to the wishes of a major ity of the taxpayers of the cit and the mayor stands with him.
The lieutenant governor -and Premier McBride have been bombarded with letters regarding the matter from several citizens, and it is now up to the government to make the next move, as it is unlikely that a nother election, under the present regime, will serve to secure a city council.
