Offices Not Built Though Equipment Is Here

NORTH VANCOUVER, B.C., Nov. 12, 1910. To the Herald:

Sir:—Would you kindly let me know, through your paper, where the government built or are going to build the government offices.

The government have not yet built their offices in the district. And will not likely do so till next year, though the paraphernalia for same is stored at South Fort George. The logical place is South Fort George, where the business of the district is done. Central or Fort George is located in the woods. It is four miles from the Fraser river and will not amount to much for three or four generations. The owners of Central or Fort George have advertised that the provincial government had erected their offices on their land. This is on a par with everything the Natural Resources Security Company do. They live and exist on falsehoods. Their business is promoting. Out of the thousands of people who have come into the district this year not a solitary one has located on their tear of townsites. They pass it up like a white chip. In contrast to this, people who have come to South Fort George, in a great number of cases. have bought property and built thereon. There is not a live man in the district who would give a pinch of snuff for the best lot in Central, wouldbe-Fort George or any other of the numerous baits dangling in the woods.

Remember that the Grand Trunk Railway have no town on the market.

The Rich Peace River Country

The Peace river country is putting a lot of people thinking these days, and since it has a local interest to the district by virtue of Summit lake, 41 miles from South Fort George, being the source of the rivers that drain that vast territory, the following Toronto despatch of a recent date is more than interesting:—

Frederick G. Lawrence, F. R. G. S., for thirty years a resident of the Peace river district, aroused keen interest in an address before the Canadian Club on the possibilities of the west. He said along the banks of all streams flowing east or west from the boundary to the Arctic ocean gold was to be found. Along the foot of the Rockies and the streams of Athabaska outcropping coal in seams of six inches to twenty-eight feet was found. Petroleum was found in such quantities that Canadians need not go to Texas to be soaked in oil. There was bitumen in immense quantities, estimated at 6,400,000,000 tons by government experts, found capable of supplying all the asphalt used, the consumption hitherto being only 200,000,000 tons altogether. The largest gas well in the world was found not far from Pelican Rapids on the Athabasca river, near the asphalt deposits. On the Mackenzie river, down to the Arctic, spruce grows two feet in diameter. He hoped Americans would be allowed to buy this timber on condition that they came over and manufactured it here. There were 65,000,000 acres of first-class agricultural land. He expected the west would eventually ship four, five and six hundred million bushels of wheat."

Here is a little wisdom from R. T. Lowery that is applicable right here at our doors: "Some people dress up and polish their shoes when there are strangers in camp, and pay no attention to folks around home. We send our best products abroad and keep the culls for the local market. Okanagan hotels serve inferior fruit. Albertan hotels put up tough beefsteaks. Manitoban hostelries provide bread that competes with lead, while at the coast fish is often served by the cafes and hotels that is only fit to be converted into a fertilizer and shipped to Japan. It is time for a change."

Russell Peden's sawmill employs 26 men and is working overtime in an endeavor to supply the demands made by South Fort George builders. The closing down of building operations on the Natural Resources townsites has allowed us an opportunity to secure an uninterrupted supply of building material. Mr. Peden expects to have a million and a half feet by spring stored in their new yards the company is building on their property adjoining the Northern hotel.

Natural Resources Want a Liquor License

The employees of the leading wildcat in the district-Central or Fort George, etc., etc.-are petitioning for a liquor license for the tumble up and uncompleted shack that has been dubbed a hotel in the woods. J. T. Carter has been hawking a petition around South Fort George for signatures for a license for the Natural Resources company's bunkhouse on the Nechaco flats. We would have refrained from even mentioning this if the Hammond tools had confined their solicitations to their own ground and not bothered respectable people. The Natural Resources Security Company advertise 600 people on their addition to FortGeorge townsite. If this is so, why do pilgrims venture forth from the monastery into realms of civilization. Six hundred should be number sufficient with which to decorate a prayer to the attorneygeneral. But their advertising lies. The Bank of Vancouver, the chicken in the financial world, knows their advertising is misleading. The two ministers resident there by no choice of their own. know or should be able to distinguish by this time, that the advertising of the Natural Resources is not based on fact. They should not stand sponsors to such barefaced exploits of the Hammonds. They should not allow a 25-foot piece of jack-pine land to stand in the way of duty. A Christian should not allow defenceless people to be entrapped by the low cunning of unprincipled promoters.

It is unnecessary to state that signatures were not obtained in South Fort George. And it likewise is unnecessary to state that the petition will not be forwarded, firstly, because there is a diversity of opinion among the employees of the Natural Resources as to the wisdom of having liquor on the townsite, and secondly, because the number of signers is limited to ten people.

Indian Agent Here

Dr. John McDougall, attached to the Indian department, was a visitor this week. This is his second trip to the Fort George reservation within six months, having been nere in July last. The object of his visit, at this time of the year, is certainly not for pleasure, for camping on the trail, building fires and melting snow for water, has ceased being delectable to him. His business here is to confer with the Indians in respect to their reservation, and while he would not say so, his visits and conferences with Chief Loui would indicate that overtures are in progress looking to the final acquisition of the reserve by the Grand Trunk Pacific railway and the removal of the Indians to land more suitable to their needs. This is in line with advices from Victoria, in which it is stated that plans have been filed with the provincial government locating their terminals on the reservation, and setting at rest for all time any uncertainty that may have existed in this respect.

District Timber Sells for a Big Figure

C. E. Mahon, of Mahon, Macfarlane & Procter, Vancouver, has just sold to British interests 105 sections of timber in the Fort George district for \$1,500,000, which is declared to be the largest price ever involved in a single deal of its kind in the history of the province. Mr. Mahon opened negotiations in connection with the transaction last spring and ten days ago heard from London that the agreement was completed. The timber consists of spruce, cedar and fir and it is stated that there are more than two billion feet of this fine lumber on the Willow river, twenty miles east of South Fort George.

In addition to the above, Mr. Mahon has disposed of three sections of timber on the Gardiner Canal. Half of the consideration is to be paid in cash in Vancouver. Most of the limits are easily accessible to the Fraser river, some ten sections being situate at Giscombe Portage. Mills will be erected on the Fraser river, in all likelihood the Hudson's Bay land, adjoining South Fort George. It was intended at one time to erect their sawmill plants on the Nechaco, but on qualified engineers reporting adversely on the navigability of this stream, the company has decided to erect their sawmills where uninterrupted communication can be had at all seasons. Mr. Birtch, Mr. Mahon's London representative, is at present negotiating for the sale of 30,-000 acres of agricultural land, which Mr. Mahon and associates own between Ootsa and Francois lakes, northwest of Quesnel and south of the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific railway.

The timber above referrred to was staked by Barney Keegan two years ago and is considered the best in the district.

Hotel Granted License

The only hotel in the district passed its examination this week and is now qualified to cater to the wants and whims, desires and decoctions of the most fastidious. Special Constable Gosby, from Victoria, arrived on Monday's stage and after an examination of the house declared it to be one of the best fitted and arranged in Cariboo. In consequence a license was granted and the bar opened to a numerous and thirsty throng who long have lived a life of enforced abstemiousness. The Hotel Northern is not only a credit to South Fort George, but likewise to the owners, Messrs. Al. Johnson and Robert Burns, both of whom are married men and of long residence in British Columbia which, in a great measure, accounts for having had the prompt attention from the department. Al. Johnson conducted the Occidental at Quesnel for many years, while Robert Burns ran the Essington hotel, at Essington, on the Skeena river, until the construction of the Grand Trunk on the opposite side of the river, depopulated the fishing town. Both should do well in South Fort George.

Back from the East

William F. Cooke arrived back Thursday afternoon after an absence of two months in the east and on the coast. While at Ottawa he interviewed the government in regard to the numerous and imperative needs of this growing section outlined in a petition forwarded by the Liberal association of South Fort George. The keen interest taken by the minister of agriculture in everything pertaining to the Fort George district, says Mr. Cooke, is an augury that the government has under consideration not only the establishment of an experimental farm, but the matter of making exhaustive surveys of the Fraser river, both above and below the Fort George canyon.

Everywhere Mr. Cooke went he found anxious people hungry for news about the district, and judging by the number of people who have expressed a determination to come to Fort George next year, there will easily be ten thousand people here next summer.

G. T. P. File Plans

VICTORIA, Nov. 12.—Plans have been filed with the provincial government locating the station grounds of the Grand Trunk Pacific railway on the Fort George Indian reservation. This seems to clear up any uncertainty regarding the location of the railway station. The company has also applied for an order restraining "wildcaters" from using "Fort George" on their literature. Otherwise, the railway claim, they must look for a new name.


