

You will no doubt be familiar with the exemptions which have been granted from the present import regulations in Germany, to the effect that "Liebesgaben" can go forward to persons or families in Germany who are short of means.

We feel convinced that many residents in Canada who have relatives in Germany will welcome an opportunity of thus being of help in the present circumstances.

Our difficulty has been to locate the German Associations in Canada to bring to the general knowledge of Germans that "Liebesgaben" can go forward, and at the same time to offer our services for the packing and dispatch of such "Liebesgaben".

We have written some Consulates in U. S. A. on the same subject, and as quite a number of Germans are living in Canada we imagine that likewise in your Country the present scheme will be welcomed.

In appreciation of the fact that you will be familiar with the names of the Presidents of the different German Associations in your area we beg leave enclosed herewith to hand you circulars destined for the said Presidents. May we ask you kindly to mail the enclosed letters together with a few lines to the respective Presidents.

We commend the enclosed circular for your perusal, and ask you kindly to accept our best thanks for your attention in mailing the letters as suggested above.
