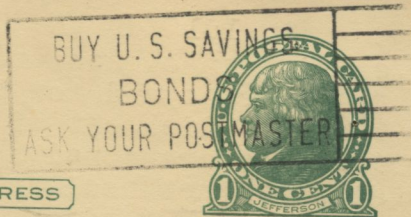

ACT 181A of the Canadian Customs is causing annoyance and trouble to exporters from Europe and now the Canadian Govt. demands the establishment of office there for 6 years if goods are consigned in the name of anyone although not residing in Canada. This Act is designed to handicap foreign trade and should be protested by the German Govt. as well as all other Govts. for the benefit of their nationals doing foreign business with Canada. Furthermore, the Canadian Govt. gives no warning or notice when you ship goods to Canada and then imposes, under threat, you to go into lot of expenses.
