and others concerned:TARIFF CHANGE BY ORDER IN COUNCIL

By Order in Council (P.C. 1414), dated the 17th June, 1937, passed under authority of Section 284 of the Customs Act, the following regulation is made and established:

REGULATION

The articles or materials enumerated in the following item, when imported for use in Canadian manufactures, shall be subject to the several rates of duties of Customs, if any, set opposite the said item, that is to say:-

Woven cord tire fabric, wholly or in chief part by weight of artificial silk or similar synthetic fibres, not to contain silk nor wool, coated with a rubber composition, when imported prior to the 1st July, 1939, by manufacturers of rubber, to be incorporated by them in pneumatic tires, in their own factories.
