## To Collectors of Customs and Excise, and others concerned:

## MARKING OF IMPORTED GOODS

Referring to Memorandum Series D No. 1, Revised 1939, you are advised that Section 8 of the general regulations, as shown on pages 2 and 3, is hereby cancelled and the following is substituted therefor, this change to be effective on and after 15th August, 1939:

8. The name of the country of origin alone, or preceded by either the words "Made in", "Produced in", "Printed in" or other words of similar import, or by the name of the manufacturer or producer, comprise the only satisfactory indication of the country of origin, provided that the relative invoices and shipping and other documents clearly indicate that the goods originated in the country so shown.

The names of provinces, states or other divisions of a country, or the names of universally known large cities preceded by the words "Made in", etc., or by the name of the manufacturer, will not be acceptable as heretofore.
