I see from your letter that your customer, Paul Bartsch, is domiciled at Saarbruecken. Saarbruecken, situated in the Sarre District, at present administered by the League of Nations, is under the French customs régime, and I assume that certificates of origin are required for shipments to these parts in the same manner as for shipments to France. I would suggest, however, that you write to Mr. Henri de Clerval, Commercial Attaché of the French Consulate General, at 6 St. Sacrament Street, Montreal, for further information.
