Dear Sirs:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your telegramm of today's date, which I presume concerns instructions about the certification of origin. As far as I am aware, there is no particular working prescribed for making the declaration of origin. I have reason to believe that invoices showing name and address of sender and consignee; number of packages; kind of packages; marks and numbers; weight-gross and net,-; transportation used (rail,mail,ship etc.); contents of packages, and bearing the following deflaration:

> "I herewith certify that the above goods are of Canadian origin"
