Dear Whitehead;-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 19th inst., and note your disagreement with some of the conclusions I have arrived at concerning the Company.

Enclosed are copies of Jarvis's letter of the 10th inst., to me and my reply of the 17th. The latter will enlighten you as to the source of part of my information. When we meet I can give you other particulars which, I believe, will demonstrate to you that I had a legitimate foundation for my conclusions.

I may add that in all the adverse criticisms I heard both from Jarvis and outsiders there was not one derogatory expression concerning you personally, nor do I feel you were in any way to blame for the Company's present position. In fact I told Jarvis I did not consider you had been given a square deal, nor the advice and assistance necessary to the position, and that had this been accorded you there would, in my opinion, have been no reason for you to resign.

I have no set date for going in to Vancouver but would be glad to arrange a meeting any time and place that suits your convenience. You set these and I will endeavour to connect.

If you have finished with the documents I sent you with my letter of the 2nd inst., I would like to have them back again.
