Dear Mr. Found,

I am in receipt of your favour of the 23rd ulto., and hasten to assure you that I have not forgotten my promise to procure you a copy of the photograph of the Fraser River fishing fleet in the olden days.

On my return from the east, I made a search for this photograph in my private residence, but was unable to find same. I then had the search continued in the office, and only last week succeeded in unearthing this. The picture is now in the hands of the photographer, who is making a copy of same, and this will be forwarded to you as soon as the work is finished.
