Dear Sirs:-

Doubtless Mr. Rudge has already advised you of the change in prices to be paid for fish, which were agreed upon at the meeting of cannery managers on Rivers Inlet on the 26th instant. These will undoubtedly affect you as well, and so that there will be no misunderstanding we give you details of the new prices as follows:-

Sockeye, Steelhead & Cohoe caught with cannery gear-	22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢	each
" " " " " independent "	32 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢	"
Humpbacks caught with cannery gear	2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢	"
" " " private "	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢	"
Dog salmon caught with cannery gear	5¢	"
" " " private "	7¢	"
White Spring salmon caught with cannery gear.....	15¢	"
" " " " private "	20¢	"

The price of Red Springs to be worked out on the same basis as last year.

The price to be paid for washing fish has been increased to 25¢ per hour, and the price for filling is to be 3¢ per tray of 28 half pound flats and 4¢ per tray of 24 one pound flats. The price of one pound flats is also 3¢ per tray of 24 cans, but as you are not packing this style it does not interest
