1. That on or about the ninth day  
of January A.D. 1866, your petitioners  
were in the petition of Messrs Anderson  
& Co of Victoria, adjudicated Bank-  
rupts by this Honorable Court;

2. That since the said adjudication  
no further steps have been taken  
by the said petitioning creditors, or  
any other of your petitioners creditors  
in the matter of the said adjudication.
