I have to report to your Lordship that the furniture removed by C. W. White has been again placed in my possession Subject to Your Lordships orders.

With the exception of the 1 Bankrupt interest - a Contingent one - in the Pioneer Rifleshall I can find no further available Assets in this Estate

The 1 Bankrupt having Complaind that his affairs had not been fully and truly represented to your Lordship. I have at his request made a Summary of Cash receipts and payments from the time he Commenced business as Real Estate Agent in 1861 up till date of Combankruptcy. This document has been Computed chiefly from the Bankrupts Verbal Statement, there being no Book entries, nor Vouchers to attest their Validity.

In addition of the Claim made against him by Mr Anna Martin the Bankrupt has put in a Contra Claim for 285/- in damages, so he stated that it was not his intention to have ~~done so~~ ^{put it in} but as Mr Martin has pursued his claim with so much bitterness he now thinks himself justified in self protection to put in this ~~set off~~ ^{set off} as a set off in part against hers.
