In the matter of a Summons re John  
Joseph McCreedy a Bankrupt

I Alexander Birch McCreedy of Victoria  
Vancouver Island late a Clerk with Mr John  
Copland a Solicitor of this Honorable Court  
make oath and say as follows that is to say

1. I am the son of John Joseph McCreedy and  
Jane Elizabeth his Wife. In the year 1860  
I purchased a lot on View Street Victoria  
of Mr Lowenberg and numbered ~~1077~~ 1077, 1078,  
1079 and 1080 on the Town Map

2 In the year One thousand eight hundred  
and sixty one in the month of September of  
that year I had a Conveyance of the Lot  
made to me and on the same day I  
borrowed Two hundred dollars on the  
Security of the said Lot of Mr William  
Culverwell

Mr. McCreedy

3 On the Twenty eighth day of May One  
Thousand eight hundred and sixty two  
I executed a Conveyance or trust Deed of  
the property to Mr Bishop and Mr Culverwell  
as trustees for my mother and for her benefit.

4. Houses were built on the said Lot by  
my Father assisted by his three Sons generally

myself among the number - the work  
was usually done after the usual working  
hours of the day

5. I intended to have left for San Francisco  
by the last Steamer the California which  
left on Wednesday but having been previously  
served with a summons to attend this Court  
last Wednesday I have remained over until  
now and it is my intention to leave by the  
Steamer "Fideliter" tomorrow via Portland.

6. My father had no interest in the  
purchase of the Lot and I made the  
conveyance solely for the benefit of my said  
Mother
