In Bankruptcy

In the matter of John Joseph McCredy
by whom a Deed of Assignment for the
benefit of his Creditors has been filed dated
the Twenty first day of June in the year of
our Lord One thousand eight hundred
and sixty six and in the matter of a
Summons issued out of this Honourable
Court and dated the 26th day of July
1866

I Thomas Henry McCredy of Victoria
Vancouver Island do now make Assistant make
oath and say as follows that is to say

1. I was formerly in the employ of the late Mr Bell an ironmonger in Victoria and on the
decease of Mr Bell Mr Edgar Marvin succeeded
to his Business. I have been in their united
employ for six years.
2. My mother drew on Mr Bell's decease a
sum of One hundred and twenty dollars wages
then owing to me. I had previously been
paying various sums of money to my mother
but of which I kept no particular account.
3. In the years One thousand eight hundred
and sixty two, sixty three, sixty four, sixty
five and sixty six I also lent and advanced

to my said Mother and also ~~paid~~^{advanced} to or
allowed out of my wages due to me from Mr
Marvin considerable sums of money as will
appear on reference to the account hereto
annexed marked M. Two items are on
sums of One hundred and thirty five dollars
and Two hundred and ninety five dollars
respectively - the first in April One thousand
eight hundred and sixty three and the other
in April One thousand and eight hundred and
sixty four were allowed by me to be deducted
out of Wages due to me from Mr Marvin and
applied for the settlement of my father's account
owing to the said Mr Marvin -

4. My said father frequently promised to give
me security for the moneys I had so advanced
and paid for him; at one time he said he
would give me a security on a lot on Fort Street
but as it afterwards appeared it was under
a mortgage to secure the balance of the unpaid
purchase money he could not do so -

5. In May last I again applied to my father
for security and he put me off from day to day
I then consulted Mr Bishop and instructed
him to obtain payment or security - after that
my father came to me and I referred him to
Mr. Bishop - I subsequently agreed to take a
Bill of Sale for the sum of One thousand dollars
and interest - If the security had not been
given I should have pressed my claims

and sued for the amount fairly due to me -
 The sum of One Thousand dollars and interest
 and much more is bona fide due to me from
 my said father - I should not have made
 the advances to the extent I did but for the
 repeated promises of security made by my
 said father and also my mother. I have been
 in possession of the said goods since the date of the security
