Notice in Bankruptcy.

In the matter of William Balcomell
a Bankrupt.

We Richard Woods acting Provincial Assignee
in the matter of the above Bankruptcy and Robert
Bishop of Victoria Vancouver Island solicitor for
the Partitioning Creditor jointly and severally make
oath and say as follows

- 1 That the goods and effects of the above named
Bankrupt was taken possession of by us in our
respective characters as above mentioned on Friday last
the Fifth day of May instant
- 2 That immediately afterward notice of claim for
rent was put in on the Premises, wherein we had
seized and lodged the goods and effects on the
Premises occupied by the Bankrupt in Government
Street Victoria aforesaid, and also notice given for
accruing Rent. —
- 3 In consequence of the insecure state of the Premises
and of the pressure by parties having claims on
the Bankrupt we deemed it advisable to have
and place two persons in possession to secure the
property.
- 4 That great expense is being incurred and continues
in consequence of our being obliged to keep or pay for
such possession and care and Rent is still daily
enhanced to grow and accrue and other expenses
are incurred which would be obviated by the
removal and early sale of the said goods and

Effects and we deem and believe it to,
be advisable that a sale should forthwith
be effected by auction of the same. —
