

In the Supreme Court of British Columbia
In re Lucy and Colton an infant
S. Chut Kil-Keta a native of Queen Charlotte
Island now residing at Jones' Landing Esquimaux
District, make oath and say.

1. In or about the month of June 1875 I gave
birth to a female child named Lucy - The
child is alive but has not been baptized.
2. The father of the child was Charles Colton
who died shortly after the birth of the child.
3. An Indian woman named Lizzie now
living with a white man on Puget Sound has
possession of the child and obtained possession
from me of the child last year in the month
of October by force at Jones Landing Esquimaux.
4. The said child is now in the city of
Victoria and the said Lizzie intends forthwith
taking her back to the Sound -
5. I have for ~~two years~~ the past fifteen
months been living with James Frederick
Roberts at Esquimaux. The child is under the
age of seven years.
