One thousand eight hundred and
seventy one about the hour of
twelve of the Clock in the night
of the same day the dwelling
house of John Hart situate in the
Town of Nanaimo Vancouver
Island aforesaid feloniously and
burglariously did break and

later with intent the goods and
chattels of the said John Hirst
in the said dwelling house then
being feloniously and burglariously
to steal take and carry away
and then in the said dwelling
house one pair of trousers a
silver Coin of the value of twenty
five Cents and other moneys
of the goods and chattels of the said
John Hirst in the said dwelling
house then being found feloniously
and burglariously did steal take
and carry away against the form of
the Statute in such case made and
provided and against the peace of
our Lady the Queen her Crown and dignity.

And the Jurers aforesaid upon their
oath aforesaid do further present
that William Cown well knowing
the said Cockayne to have done
and committed the said felony
and larceny in form aforesaid
afterward, to wit on the day
and year aforesaid that the
said Cockayne did feloniously
receive harbour and maintain
against the form of the Statute
in such case made and
provided and against the peace
of our Lady the Queen her
Crown and deputy.
