lawfully in the custody of Philip
Woolacott Gaoler of the Victoria Gaol
under and by virtue of a warrant of
A. F. Pemberton Esq. Stipendiary
Magistrate upon a summary conviction
for Larceny hath unlawfully and
wilfully escaped from the said Gaol
and from and out of the custody of him
the said Philip Woolacott the keeper
thereof before the expiration of a certain
time for which he the said Coma
was ordered to be imprisoned and kept
to hard labour therein contrary to
the statute in such case made and
provided -

COLONY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA
AND ITS DEPENDENCIES.
To WIT.

THE INFORMATION AND COMPLAINT of *William M. Evans*,
of *Victoria*, taken this 27th day of *June*
1871, before the undersigned, one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said Colony
of British Columbia and its Dependencies, who, being duly sworn, upon oath deposeth saith:—

On the afternoon of the 21st inst. at about
3 o'clock was in company of part of the
chain gang with fardous government
House Victoria with Colony aforesaid
when the Indian *Couina* who was one
of the gang broke away and escaped.
in Company with the Indian *Tommy*-
Open *Stafford* and *Sandie* *Couina*
the same night in Commissariat Stab.
