The officials of the Lyee Copper Company were well pleased with the results of the day's operations. The tramway can send down 500 tons a lay.

A great deal of interest is felt by mining and smelting men in the ingenious arrangement, the invention of Mr. T. Kiddie, manager, at the Tyee roasting grounds for conveying the ore is taken from the bunkers to the roast piles. This is the arrangement whereby the ore is taken from the bunker on a travelling bridge, run over the roast piles and dropped thereon. Of course the heat from the roast piles is great, and the question, that seems to be worrying the mining men referred to is whether this great heat directed by the wind might not endanger the safety of the uprights on which the travelling bridge runs. It is understood that this is an experiment, but the idea is certainly ingenious, and if euccessful will facilitate the work of roasting.


