Port Moody was chosen as the western terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway. The location, at the heart of Burrard Inlet, made the strategic connection between other nations and our own transcontinental railway, and shaped the industrial and community life of today.

The first transcontinental train reached Port Moody the day after the "Last Spike" was driven at Craigellachie on Nov. 7, 1885. Here, years later, a train from the final terminus in Vancouver, leaves Port Moody thundering eastward.
