My Dear Sister:

I received your welcome letter and parcel a few days ago and was sure glad to hear from you. You certainly made a good choice in sending me what you did as everything was great. We can't buy hardly any eats here at all.

I am not in Bramshott now but will be back in a couple of weeks. I am at Mitchett Rifle Range

doing rifle practice. I am making
some good shooting. This is about
20 miles from our home camp.

Say Luie did Rose write to you?
If you answer her at all write
as good as you can will you. I told
her my name was Billy so you
needn't put her any the wiser.

Say Luie who was the girl that
made those socks for me? Send me
her address will you so I can thank
her for it. I am writing to about 17
girls now so I guess one more won't
hurt.

I hear from Lee Hong about once
in two weeks. It will be only
4 or 5 weeks before I will be
there too. There is a lot of boys

coming over every day. Our camp is full nearly all the time.

Will you send me about a pound of lump sugar the next time you write as it can't be got here. If you can get a few good post cards send me a few of them.

I have signed some pay over to you but I don't know when you will get it as it takes several months for them to get things straightened out.

We are having rain here every day and don't know when it is going to quit.

How is everybody in Rambocks. Will our big brother ever have to join up. Tell him it is pretty poor business

If we have good luck it will be
at least two years before we get
back. Do you think you will remember
me by then.

Well I guess I will close as it
is getting late. Hoping to hear
from you soon I remain
