Dear Sister.

I received your most welcome letter to-day and was glad to hear from you. I hope you are not sore at me for not writing offener. I don't blame you but I will try and do a little better from now on.

I just came back from a six days leave and am feeling quite tired. I was in London all the time and I had a swell time. The weather was

fine. Your pictures were real nice and I see you are getting to be quite a big girl. Do you work hard.

I got a letter from Mabel Lee a few days ago and I am going to answer it as soon as I get through with this one.

Dear sister I have met a lot of girls over here and I must have about 13 girls to write to. There is about 7 girls to every boy over here. There is a lot of our boys getting married over here. Our girls at home will be

getting sore.

I will be going to France
in a few days and there where
I will be getting your next
letter.

How is everything at home
Lucy. Is Willie still at home.

You asked me to give you
some addresses of boys in my
battalion. You see, I am in an
Alta. Res. and as soon as I
get to my battalion I will
send you some of their addresses.
I think they will be glad to

hear from you.

I think I will try and see
Lee Hong as soon as I get
over there.

will have to close as I am
