Somewhere in France
Sept 17, 1918

My Dear Sister:

Just a few lines to let you know that I am well hoping you and all the folks are the same. We are getting a lot of rain these days and the mud is ankle deep everywhere.

How is the crops around home these days. The people here are all busy digging their potatoes and threshing grain. Sometimes when we have time we go and help them just for the fun of it. Everybody here works and the kids too.

Say Marguerite you should see these airplanes here. They just look like a flock of geese going south in the fall. They

travel in just the same formation
I have seen a lot of the boys
who I knew in civil life but haven't
had a chance to speak to them.

We are getting a lot of apples
here now but they are small not
near as big as they are back home.
Did you get those souvineers. I sent
you them from England, I will
send you some more soon.

Well as there isn't much news
here I will have to close. I hope
you will send me letters regular
and if you don't get some in time
don't think I didn't write as it
is hard for us to get to where we
can write.
