Somewhere in France
Oct. 7, 1918

Dear Sister:

Just a few lines to let you know that I am still in existence. I came out of the great battle without a scratch but it was a close shave, as my gas mask and water bottle was shot away.

We have been having some fine weather lately and I hope it will continue for a while.

I got your letter a while ago but you will have to excuse me for not writing as we only get a rare chance to write. So far I have only got one letter from Mabel Lee, and none from

the other girls you was talking about.
I got your cards and photos and
they were sure fine. I haven't got
the parcel yet but I suppose I will
get it soon as it takes sometimes
two months to come.

I had all kinds of fun in the
big drive. I had all the shooting
I wanted and believe me those
machine guns and whiz-bangs make
a person hug the ground sometimes
I think we got old Fritz going
now. It will be only a matter
of time before he will give in
but it can't be too soon for me.
I will soon be like a badger as
we had to dig in about twice a day
while we were in the big drive and
believe me I was pawing dirt too as
the sharp and bullets we coming



pretty thick at all times.

We get quite a lot of sugar here so don't bother sending any more of it. We can't buy a thing over here but milk and biscuits and most of the time we can't get that so anything you have sent I have been tickled to death to get and am glad someone haven't forgot me.
