asked her if she was sick and she said she was not; this would be on January 10th; Mr. Davis asked me to make a cup of tea for Mrs. Brown; I asked him what the trouble was, and he told him that I did not keep boarders; I heard no answer to that remark, and the request was repeated; I again asked him what was wrong; I made the tea and Mrs. Davis took it to her; I saw her lying in bed on the morning of the 21st, and asked her what was the matter with her; she said nothing; on the 23rd I asked what was the trouble; I told her I was washing, and she said if I would wait until tomorrow she would help me; I was called to her room on the morning of the 19th and given a note to give to Dr. Langis; I said "Mrs. Brown, what is the trouble?" and she answered, "The same old trouble, inflammation has come on"; my husband delivered the note to Dr. Langis's house; I did not see anyone come to my house except Mr. Davis. To a question by Mr. Moresby written and I asked Mrs. Brown what was the matter with her and she said her sickness had stopped for three months and had only just come on again; on a previous occasion I told her that if she was going to be sick she must leave my house and find some other place; Mrs. Brown replied that she was not going to be sick in the way I thought; I saw Dr. Langis leave my house with a strange woman on January 19th; I have missed no bed clothes; I was not aware of Mrs. Brown being confined in my house; Mrs. Brown left my house, as far as I know, on the following Saturday, but I don't know where she went; I saw her going on the road to Westminster; when Mrs. Brown left I saw the hackman carry away a small valise about eighteen inches long.

Mr. Bull, the next witness, said: "I live at Straveston on the first of this month I was living at the North Arm; some time in February Mrs. Brown was in my house for three or four weeks; she left the Friday before March 6; my wife, Mrs. Brown, her boy and myself all left on the same day; Mrs. Brown stopped behind a few minutes and we waited on the road for her; it might have been ten or fifteen minutes; when Mrs. Brown caught up with us she had a little hand-bag six or eight inches long; when she came to us she had this small bag and a valise about eighteen or twenty inches long; this valise was quite heavy; I heard something rattling in the valise like a bottle with water in it; the wrapper and apron that I saw her wear would not fill the valise and make it as heavy as when she brought it; I carried this valise away and it was very light and my wife said that her washing was left at the house."

Mrs. Bull, sworn, said: "I was living on the North Arm on the first of March; I know the prisoner, Mrs. Brown; she stopped with me for nearly a month; she came from Vancouver by way of Westminster; she brought a small hand-bag and a valise about 20 inches long; I never saw what that valise contained, but I saw some of the clothes that came out; these were a flannel wrapper, a suit of underwear, a couple of aprons, and a pair of stockings; I understood that there was more in the valise, as Mrs. Brown told me she had another suit of underwear; Mrs. Brown told me she had been sick and when I was at Mrs. Ellis's house and saw her in bed she told me she had inflammation of the bowels; I asked her to come to my house and she said she would when she got well enough; after Mrs. Brown came to my house she said she had Dr. Langis attending her the morning we all left and Mrs. Brown stated behind; I should judge that we went about a quarter of a mile before she caught up with us; she did not say anything when she came up; I know a log come out from our front door and I think I should have seen a parcel or bundle if one had been near it."

Mrs. Elizabeth Brown, the next witness, stated: "The prisoner is my daughter-in-law; I cannot swear that the shawl produced was Mrs. Brown's; I think the pattern of her's is smaller."

Mrs. Armstrong, sworn, said: "I know the prisoner; she is my sister-in-law; I do not know the shawl produced; I have not seen Mrs. Brown's shawl for two years; I thought it was Mrs. Brown's when I saw it, but I did not examine it; now I do so, I don't think it is Mrs. Brown's."

This ended the case for the crown. Mr. Jones held that there was no evidence before the court to justify a verdict for trial, and no evidence had been proved and the doctor's evidence went to show that Mrs. Brown had done all in her power to have the child well looked after, having sent for a nurse and failing to secure one had not a friend to come to her.

Mr. Moresby contended that the evidence adduced was quite sufficient to secure a conviction. From the first the prisoner had tried to conceal the birth of the child, and had after its birth failed to give it proper care. After some deliberation the magistrate decided that the evidence before him was sufficient to warrant a conviction, and therefore committed the prisoner for trial. An application for bail by the witness for the crown was refused. Over in the sum of \$2500 each to appear at the next assizes, and the court adjourned.
