BALMACEA BEATEN COMPLETE ROUT OF THE TYRANT'S FORCES NEAR SANTIAGO. Valparaiso Delivered to the German Admiral—A Second Battle Fought Which the Congressionalists Won. The Statesville Disaster—Surprising That Any Passengers Escaped Death—An Arizona Railway Bridge Burner Arrested—Intense Excitement.

WASHINGTON, D. C., August 28.—Acting Secretary Wharton of the State Department, received the following cable tonight from the United States Consul McGreevy at Valparaiso: A battle was fought near Santiago de Chile this morning and the government forces were badly beaten. There is heavy loss on both sides. The city surrendered to the opposition, but forces of the admirals of the American, German and English fleets were in good order. No communication with Santiago. Opposition forces now entering the city.

Another Confirmation. WASHINGTON, D. C., August 28.—The Chilean congressional envoys in Washington received the following cablegram late this afternoon: Lima, August 28.—Pedro Montt. The triumph complete. Valparaiso surrendered. (Signed) Vial.

SOUTHERN RAILWAY.

Hon. H. V. Thompson Tells When the Road Will be Opened for Traffic. The great Southern Railway system so far as its coast line is concerned will consist of the Westminster Southern, extending from New Westminster to Blaine, the Fairview and Southern, extending from Blaine south to its connection with the Seattle and Montana, the Seattle and Portland, and the Seattle and Tacoma. At present there is the Seattle and Montana a gap of five or six miles of iron to lay and about eight miles of ballast, all the material for which has arrived on the ground. This track is being laid at the average rate of a mile and a half a day and the ballasting is being done as rapidly as possible. Immediately on the completion of that branch of the road—two weeks at the outside—the work will be through to the city to Westy shore. To Perth and the work of constructing the Portland and Puget Sound road will be pushed forward as rapidly as possible. The completion of this entire line—a matter of a few short months—will give Westminster, in addition to its present outlet by sea and river and by the C.P.R. on land, one by way of the Northern Pacific, one by way of the Union Pacific and one by the Southern Pacific also. In fact, it brings our railway into the complete and direct connection with the great American and Canadian continental lines.
