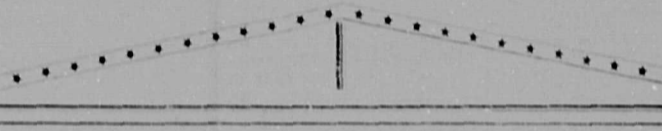

**SCIENCE AND PROGRESS.**  
**Lightning Sometimes Proceeds From the Earth as Well as the Clouds.**  
During the progress of electrical storms in this State it was noted in several places that electrical discharges passed from the earth to the clouds, as well as from the clouds to the earth. The Post-Express described this phenomenon as observed at Iroquois Bay. A gentleman who recently returned from the Adirondacks observed the same electrical action. Discharges passed from the hills across Star Lake to the clouds, and from the clouds to the hills. Similar observations were made in the city in 1887 or 1888. Preceding this the electrical discharges in New Zealand, June 11, 1861, electric fibrils or meteors were observed to pass from the earth. These electrical discharges were from regions considerably removed from the volcanic craters.  
It has been urged that the eye cannot detect the direction of a lightning flash, and that the passage of a discharge from the earth to the sky is only apparent, an optical illusion. This objection is employed mainly to support a theory that the passage is always from the sky to the earth. If the reasoning of the objection be correct, what there to support the theory that the passage is always from the earth to the sky? The statement that discharges are invariably from the sky to the earth is based on observation, and has no other basis. An object on the earth may be shattered by a lightning flash, or a discharge from the earth to the sky may be seen as a discharge from the sky to the earth. The shattering force is shown when the fluid passes from one medium to another. The testimony of sight must be accepted in case of apparent passages of the lightning from earth to sky if it is accepted in case of passages from sky to earth.—Bohmer (N. Y.) Democrat.

**Mineral India Rubber Asphalt.**  
According to the Transactions of the Mechanical Electrician, another article formerly considered worthless has been added to the useful products, and is known as mineral India rubber asphalt. It is produced during the process of refining tar by sulphuric acid, and forms a black material very strong and elastic asphalt and elastic India rubber. When heated so that the asphalt matter is reduced to about 60 per cent. of the former size, a hard and elastic material is produced. It can be dissolved in turpentine, and is an excellent non-conductor of electricity, and therefore, valuable for covering telegraph wires and other purposes where a non-conducting substance is needed. Discard the mineral India rubber asphalt as a waste material. It is said to be very profitable, and to pay the inventor \$500 to \$500 per cent.

**The Moon's Influence on the Weather.**  
The Nature commenting on an article on the influence of the moon on weather by Dr. G. Meyer says that although such investigations have hitherto given a negative result, the author thought that with the materials furnished by cyclic charts he might eliminate local influences, and give tables extending over a number of years which seem to show the influence of the moon in lowering the height of the barometer in the months of September to January at the time of full moon, and in raising it during the first quarter. The Deutsche Seewarte, which commends the article, points out that a similar result has been independently arrived at by Capt. Smeaton, one of the assistants of the expedition. The same effect may exist but is perceptible in other months.

**Gloves in Ancient Times.**  
The antiquity of gloves, though remote, may not run even with that of the human hand. It is claimed, however, that distinct evidence is given of their use by the cavemen. Mr. M. W. Beck, whose researches upon gloves are very full and minute, notes the fact that where the drawing off of the shoe is referred to in the book of Ruth the "shoe" should be translated "glove." The Hebrew scholars who make this contention say also that the shoe is never made a token of faith, but is only associated "with acts of humility and abasement." So in Psalm cviii., where it is said, "Over Edom will I cast out my shoe," the word "shoe" should be "glove." For "to throw a glove over Edom" would accord with all precedent in conveying a challenge, or the utterance of a boastful promise of punishment. To throw a shoe would have no war-like significance whatever.

Among the heretics it is certain gloves were used simply of rank, or used for display, as with all early peoples. Ancient paintings of a rural kind exhibit them on the hands of kings and persons high in authority. For every day wear and among the common people a more primitive device prevailed for purposes of protection, since "the sleeves of both sexes were long and ample, and readily available for hand-coverings when defence against inclemency of the weather was needed." The cloak, too, when it was of liberal size and warmth, could be easily made to cover the hands securely.

Certain Roman writers thought it was a species of effeminacy to wear gloves, but his inventive against them had little effect. Among the epicureans, or, one might better say, gluttons—of Rome gloves were worn at the table. As the knife and fork were not then used, it being the custom to carve and handle the viands with the fingers, those who had their hands labored could hold the hottest meats without trouble, and were sure to get a larger share than the persons who dined unaided.  
Whether the Romans introduced the glove into England is not established. It was found there, however, in Anglo-Saxon times. The poem of "Beowulf," a seventh-century romance, mentions the glove; and not much later, gloves figure in the customs law as a part of the duty paid by German merchants. Allowance ecclesiastical to wear gloves in church while the laity were to remove theirs was an odd rule, while gloves were, in fact, put on the Bishop at his ordination, and in his consecration of his office. A prayer in some form or other of the old missal offered by ecclesiastical contains the petition "that I may be clothed with pure hands." Among the church trappings of the Middle Ages highly ornamented gloves are enumerated. Gold, silver, and precious stones were employed in making them, and there was also much of lavish decoration.—Jed Newton, in Harper's Bazar.
