## BODY OF JOHN MORRISON FOUND

### Floating Outside the Island Below the Skeena.

#### Left Essington On July 17th and Supposed to Have Drowned Two Days Later—Went Out to Fish—Father Lives in Prince Rupert.

The body of John Morrison was found on Thursday just outside the island below the Skeena river after the deceased has been missing since Sunday, July 17th. Morrison left Port Essington early in the morning in his sailing fishing boat and headed for the North Pacific Cannery. His partner was supposed to have gone with him, but was later in getting to the wharf and was left behind, but he saw Morrison out in the boat. That is the last seen of him until his body was found on Thursday. The partner went to the cannery two days later and found that Morrison had not showed up yet and then they began to

feel uneasy, but no trace was found of him until early Thursday. The boat with the sail set was first found and then the body was located and it was taken to Port Essington about five o'clock in the afternoon.

Word was sent to Chief of Provincial Police Wynn and he went over yesterday and made an investigation. He ordered a doctor to examine the remains to see if there was any trace of violence. The generally accepted theory in Essington is that it was a purely accidental drowning and that it occurred a week ago last Tuesday, or two days after he was out at sea. The report of the doctor is expected in the city on the Chieftain this afternoon and when that arrives the chief and coroner will decide whether or not to hold an inquest.

Morrison was 5 feet 8 inches tall and of slight build. He is supposed to have a father living in or near Prince Rupert, but thus far the police have been unable to locate him. Anyone having any knowledge of Morrison Sr, is requested to notify Chief Wynn.

## FELL ON A SAW

### Man at Woodworth Lake Cut an Artery In His Wrist

One of the members of the logging gang working on the cabin at Woodworth Lake fell on a saw on Wednesday and cut an artery in his wrist. The men in camp bound the arm above and below the wound to prevent bleeding and hurried the man down to the hospital where he is doing as well as can be expected.

## OFF TO GEORGETOWN

### To Inspect the Water Power Owned By the Saw Mill Co.

The Mayor and City Engineer and a number of aldermen left this morning for Georgetown where they will inspect the water power which is owned by the Georgetown Saw Mill Co. It was intended to go up there last Sunday but was postponed until today. The party will return this evening and an early date will report to the council.

## LOCAL OPTION CAMPAIGN ON

### The Citizens Will Have to Vote On It Soon.

#### Ald. Naden Says it Will Carry—Mayor Stork For Licenses.—G. W. Morrow Says It is a Dead Issue.—Some Facts and Opinions.

The local option campaign is now becoming the liveliest topic of general interest in the city. The temperance people have been working quietly for some weeks and have secured petitions representing 25 per cent of the electors which will be filed on August 11 at Atlin. Ten days later they will be forwarded to Ottawa and the vote will be brought on soon after, providing there are no technicalities to interfere.

The voting can hardly take place before the end of September and in the meantime licenses may be granted by the commissioners. The temperance party intend making a strenuous fight

and will probably bring in some outside talent to address public meetings. The liquor interests will also be in the fight and a good subscription list has already been gathered from among those making application for licenses. They are organizing to present their side of the question.

If the electors vote in favor of local option it will not only do away with all public licenses but will also cancel the club licenses already existing in the city.

### Mayor Does Not Know

"Do you think the local option will carry" was asked Mayor Stork by the Optimist yesterday.

"I have not the faintest idea," replied the mayor. "I am in a position now where I am not supposed to say anything. I am supposed to carry out the wishes of the people. The last election I fought for licenses and was elected largely on that ticket. I have fought for them since. It is not for me

## MUCH DEPENDS ON CORN CROP

### PLUNGER PATTEN GIVES HIS VIEWS OF DEPRESSION

#### Oat Crop Short, Wheat Crop Short, Hay Crop Short—If Corn Crop is Short Owing to Drouth There Will Be Bad Times Everywhere.

New York, July 26.—Reiterating his declaration that he would never again re-enter the speculative arena and declaring that in his opinion the crux of the financial situation lay with the grain crops, particularly corn, James A. Patten, the erstwhile cotton king, sailed today for Europe on the steamer Kroonland. He was accompanied by his partner, William H. Bartlett, of Chicago, and by William I. Clough of Boston.

"It seems the crux of the financial situation this fall," said Mr. Patten, "depends on good crops. The oat crop is short, wheat is short and hay is short. Now if corn fails the country might have a period of dull times. A great deal depends on the drought. The entire corn belt has had a serious deficiency of moisture since March."

## RAILWAY FOR GRAHAM

### Government Engineer Sent to Island to Prepare Report

C. L. McCammon, the well known engineer, has just returned from an extended tour through Graham Island of the Queen Charlotte group, upon which he left some weeks ago under special instructions from the Provincial Government, for the purpose of reporting upon certain proposals that have been advanced relative to comprehensive railway construction in that part of the province.

No public announcement as to the contents of Mr. McCammon's report can yet be made.—Colonist.

## Williams Elects Today

G. T. Williams who confessed to being guilty of arson will appear before Judge Young this afternoon to elect for trial. It is expected he will ask for a speedy trial in which case the hearing will probably be next Tuesday.

## DOMINION WARSHIP

### Admiralty Agrees to Alterations In Cruiser Niobe

London, July 27.—Rear Admiral Charles E. Kingsmill returns to Canada in a fortnight. The admiralty has agreed to alterations in the Niobe as suggested by Canada. The Niobe will not sail for Canada until Sept. 2. The Rainbow sails the first week in August. The admiralty has agreed to lend skilled ratings and instructional staff officers for the safe conduct of the ship. Rear Admiral Kingsmill states that inquiries are now being made among the firms on the admiralty list for tenders for the construction of four vessels of the Bristol type and six destroyers.

## IVY IS NOW A BRITISH BOAT

### HAS BEEN PURCHASED BY D. D. MAN FOR STEWART

#### Will Be Used As a Barge To Carry Rails and Railway Supplies From Prince Rupert for Portland Canal Short Line.

The barque Ivy, now at the Grand Trunk dock loading rails, has been bought from a Vancouver firm by D. D. Mann for the Portland canal short line railroad—being the first floating property acquired by Mr. Mann on the Pacific—and is being registered at the port of Victoria. The Ivy, which came from the China coast some years ago and after lying disengaged at Esquimalt for some time, was sold to Vancouver shipping men and is being transferred to the British flag. She has been dismantled and will be used as a barge by the railway company to carry rails and supplies to Stewart and other points. A shipment of 2000 tons of rails is included in the cargo being discharged by the steamer Belle of Scotland at Prince Rupert and these will be taken to Stewart by the Ivy.

## Calgary University Project

Calgary, July 27.—The matter of a civic grant towards a Calgary university was taken up at last night's meeting of the city council, and it was decided to put a bylaw before the people sanctioning an appropriation of \$150,000 for such purpose.

## HUMBOLDT VS. WHITE PASS

### NOW CARRIED FIGHT TO THE SUPREME COURT

#### Adverse Decision of Interstate Commerce Commission To Be Strenuously Attacked Before Highest Court in the United States.

Vancouver July 26.—The announcement of another legal move by the Humboldt Steamship company against the White Pass & Yukon railroad, following a recent decision of the interstate commerce commission, was made at Washington, D. C., yesterday and aroused considerable interest in local shipping circles, which thought the matter closed. When asked the meaning of the move General Manager Max Kalish, of the Humboldt company, referred the matter to the company's attorney, Charles F. Munday, who is now in Alaska. Mr. Kalish asserted, however, that the case had really just started. The suit before the United States supreme court was decided as the best measure, owing to the fact that the commission's decision was reserved until after the adjournment of congress, thus preventing the passage of a measure of relief.

The case grows out of alleged discrimination by the railroad company against the Humboldt Steamship Company in refusing through bills of lading on freight and through rates on passengers for interior Alaska carried from Seattle to Skagway on the steamer Humboldt. The adverse decision of the commission was by a vote of four to three, Commissioners Knapp, Prouty, Harlan, and Clark voting against the Humboldt Company, and Clements, Cockrell and Lane dissenting.

## BIG TRAMPS CHARTERED

### Both Belle of Scotland and Bannockburn Have Secured Cargoes

The British steamers Belle of Scotland and Bannockburn engaged in rail carrying from Sydney, C. B., to Prince Rupert, have secured outward charters. The Belle of Scotland is now at Prince Rupert discharging a cargo of rails, after which she will proceed to the Columbia River to load lumber for China under charter to the China Import and Sugar Company.

The Bannockburn, which is loading rails at Sydney, V. C., for Prince Rupert will load barley at San Francisco for Europe under charter to Strauss & Co.

## LONGEST SINGLE SENDING WIRE

### DEVELOPMENT OF CANADIAN CABLE SYSTEM

#### Messages to be Relayed Only Five Times Between Sydney, Australia and London, England.—One Stretch Over Six Thousand Miles.

Montreal, July 26.—What will be the longest single wire in the world will in the course of a few months be an accomplished fact, it being the intention of the Pacific Cable company and the Canadian Pacific Telegraph company to inaugurate by the aid of the most modern of mechanical devices in telegraphic transmission and a new copper wire from Montreal to Vancouver, a direct transmission cable service from the Fanning Islands to Montreal, a distance of over 6,500 miles.

The object of the companies is to have not more than five sendings between Sydney, Australia, and London, England. The new order will do away with some of the handling of the messages and reduce the possibility of error. The first relay will be from Sydney to Fiji, then to Fanning, and from there to Montreal, then to the cable station at Canso and on to London.

## WHO WANTS A PRETTY ISLAND

### BULLY CHANCE FOR REAL ESTATE SPECULATORS

#### Floating Island That Nobody Owned Discovered in the China Seas Declared to be a Menace to all Navigation.

Portland, Ore., July 27.—Covered with palm trees there is an island floating around in the South China Sea, according to the officers of the British steamer Inverness, Captain J. E. Venus, who has sent a detailed report of their discovery to John McNulty, nautical expert in charge of the local branch hydrographic office. An account of the affair was received by Mr. McNulty this morning. The island is in the path of ships and is considered a menace to navigation. Referring to it G. E. Furth, the first officer, says:

"It was probably detached from the islands in that vicinity. The information regarding the above-stated danger was signaled to the French mail steamship Senegal, which passed some three hours later, it being in the direct track of shipping."

The mate also stated the island which has made its escape was covered with palm trees. The Inverness sighted it May 26 at 6:20 o'clock in the evening. Its position is given as 2:50 north latitude and 105:22 east longitude.

With a cargo of lumber the Inverness left Portland for Calcutta on April 10. The report indicates that the island, dotted as it is with a mass of swaying palms, possesses great commercial value. Hence it has been suggested that as soon as the matter becomes generally known some salvage company may dispatch powerful tugs in search of the floating property.

## Is Appointed Secretary

Ottawa, July 27.—Rodolphe Des Rochers, who for some years has been assistant secretary of the department of public works is promoted to the position of secretary of the department, the position being rendered vacant by the death of Mr. Napoleon Tessier. The appointment has just been announced.

## VISITORS IN WRONG

to say now what will be done, may be done, or should be done."

### Sure It Will Carry

Ald. G. R. Naden was asked the same question as the mayor. He replied that he did not know, but added "if local option requires only 50 per cent, or over of the votes cast it will surely be carried. When the vote was taken some time ago there was a very strong vote for the measure. A lot of the liquor interest voters have left town since then. I also believe that local option will get a strong vote from the blind pig men as they would have a better chance to operate under local option than under license. Of course the new Canada Temperance Act will make it much easier to keep the blind pigs down, but they will operate just the same. It would be as easy to stop water running down hill than to close blind pigs in a local option town.

### A Dead Issue

It was reported that G. W. Morrow who was an ardent supporter of the plebiscite had refused to sign the petition and he was questioned regarding the rumor by the Optimist.

"Yes," said Mr. Morrow, "I refused to sign the petition because the issue has already been fought out and is a dead one. During the campaign in which I was a candidate the plebiscite was the main plank in our platform which differed from that of our opponents. You will remember it read like this: "Before any licenses are granted a plebiscite is to be submitted to the people, such plebiscite to be submitted immediately after the organization of the council."

At every meeting this question was thoroughly discussed and I made plain to the public that if I were elected I would endeavor to have this plank carried out to the letter. Mr. Stork and his ticket, on the other hand came

out openly in favor of licenses without a plebiscite, and a large majority of the electors, temperance and church people included, supported him, his ticket and licenses. Therefore for me to say I am not satisfied with the verdict of the people on this question it seems to me would be most disroyal.

The electors were given an opportunity to have a plebiscite and they emphatically stated they did not want it.

"If we had not made the plebiscite an issue the position I would take would be entirely different, as I believe in the principle of the referendum. The people in electing Mr. Stork and his ricket settled the question of licenses and it is only far to the council that they should be permitted unhampered to carry out their policy as endorsed by the people."

### Want Licenses Held Up

License Commissioner Merryfield, who signed the petition said he had been asked by a representative of the temperance party if he would defer the granting of licenses until after the proposed vote is taken. His reply was that he would not so far as he was concerned, but that as soon as the commissioners could legally grant licenses he would be in favor of granting them. That means a matter of about six weeks yet.

R. C. Bean who has taken an active part in the local option organization, says the vote will be largely in favor of prohibition. Those entitled to vote are all whose names appear on the last provincial list resident in Prince Rupert. There are 918 names on the list and about

### Liquor Drinking Declining

A recently issued official return of the Department of Inland Revenue of Canada shows that under the license system generally prevailing in the Dominion, the consumption of spirituous liquors is steadily declining, while the use of beer and porter has gained but only in almost microscopic ratio. During the fiscal years closing March 31 last, the people of Canada consumed spirits to the amount of .815 gallons per capita, as compared with .806 in the year previous. The consumption of beer etc. per head of population, was 5.276 gallons, wine .97 gallons, and of tobacco 2.940 pounds. In the preceding year the consumption per head of beer was 5.348 gallons, of wine .85 gallons, and of tobacco 2.910 pounds. As compared with 30 years ago, when upwards of two gallons of liquor per capita was averaged, the present use of liquor throughout the Dominion is very small. On the other hand there have been slight increases in the consumption of beer and of tobacco.

### COMMERCIAL CENTER

#### Growing Importance of Prince Rupert Recognized Outside

J. A. Owen, for some time the traveling representative of Clark & Ives, is now the northern representative of the large Vancouver wholesale house of W. H. Malkin & Co. He is searching for an office and will continue to make this city his permanent home. This will make six representatives of the large wholesale houses of Vancouver and Victoria that are maintained at Prince Rupert.

### Lakelse Strawberries.

E. F. Michand of Lakelse Valley is registered at the New Knox. Mr Michand is a rancher in the interior and brought down a shipment of some of the finest strawberries ever seen in the city. They were large, luscious and sweet. He has a half acre plot of them and got a splendid crop off the vines. There is a good market for them in the interior at 25c per box but some were brought down as an advertisement and sold here as high as 35c per box. Mr Michand has an orchard of apple and plum trees which are doing fine but not bearing as yet. He thinks Lakelse Valley is going to be a great fruit country.

### Salmon Shipment a Success.

London, July 26.—The shipment of British Columbia frozen salmon to the English market has been a success. The profits are placed at 50 per cent.

Secretary Halsey Able to Make Encouraging Reports.

Secretary Halsey of the Skeena Agricultural and Industrial association, reports that the people along the Skeena as far as the Bulkley Valley, and those of Queen Charlotte Island, Swanson Bay, Bella Coola and other points, are showing enthusiasm in preparing to make exhibits at the forthcoming fair, and he has no doubt the showing of what the land can produce will be a surprise to many people.

The mining men are at work also, but not so much has been heard from them. They probably have not realized that the finest advertisement possible for their mining properties will be the placing of the ore specimens from this district on exhibition at the New Westminster fair in October; also that these same specimens will form the nucleus of a permanent collection in this city, where they can be readily referred to when the money of visitors whistles for mines.

**SURVEYORS ARE LOCATING LINE**

**FROM WOODWORTH LAKE TO SCHWATLANS PASSAGE**

**Waterworks Pipe Line Will Not Be Started For Some Time—Surveyors Will Be at Work for a Month—Build Measuring Weir Next Week**

City Engineer Davis paid a visit to Woodworth Lake on Thursday to see how the survey party under Engineer A. W. Agnew is getting on. He reports that the work is progressing very well. In the camp one cabin will be finished this week and then the men who have been working on that will start building the measuring weir, which, by the way it is used for measuring the amount of water going over the dam.

The surveyors are locating a line for the main pipes from the foot of Woodworth lake to Schwatlans passage. This line will be kept as far up the mountain as possible until nearing the passage when it will begin to come down. The total fall from Woodworth lake to low tide is 354 feet and that will furnish plenty of pressure on the city mains for fire protection and for consumption. In future if required the reservoir on Accropolis Hill will be completed. It is 300 feet above low tide or only 54 feet below the lake and will furnish all the presxure required for many years to come.

To complete the survey work will require a month, and was it not for the fact that Engineer Agnew already had a lot of information in his possession it would have taken a much longer period. He had the surveys of the two lakes and of the creek connecting them. Now they have to get their line from the foot of the lake over to the passage and it will not pass near the creek or Schwatlans lake. It will be some time yet before pipe laying can start.

SENSATION WHEN FLYING THROUGH THE AIR

British Expert Declares That Enthusiasts Can Master the Art in Less Than An Hour

Cecil Grace who is regarded as one of three best English aviators, is a young man of 26. An Irishman, born in Chile, he has that charming sensitive personality which is the peculiar possession of the Irish gentlemen.

"I never saw a flying machine until the Rheims meeting," he said in an interview published in the London Standard. "I was there all the time and missed nothing. Then it was that the fascinations of flying grew upon me and I determined to try my luck.

"I made a number of experiments with gliders, and I have never regretted the time spent on these experiments, for reasons which I will explain later.

"I came to Shellbeach and made my first independent flight on Moore-Brabazon's 'Bird of Passage'—you see the old machine hanging up in Mr. Short's workshop. I think the 'Bird of Passage' was the 'nurse' that taught many of us to walk—or at least to fly.

"I had already had some experiences, for Latham had taken me up in his Antoinette. No, I did not feel nervous, for I had such unbounded faith and confidence in Latham.

"You may know how it feels to fly? It is rather difficult to explain in so many words. When one starts, there is so much excitement in the experience that I believe even the most nervous man would forget to feel afraid. At any rate I do not remember ever having any sensation of fear."

"I have plenty of nerves, only they are not air nerves. For instance, when I am travelling at a high rate of speed on a motor car I am inclined to get jumpy. Nor

am I perfectly happy on a cricket field, and I think a great deal more about the chances of being hit with a fast ball than ever I have about falling. Flying calls for certain peculiar qualities and nerves. One must not be subject to vertigo, and I should imagine a mountain climber has exactly the balance of brain requisite in an aviator.

"The first sensation you have when you start to fly is the same as one has on one's first motor ride. You go with a swift run over the ground. You may have little pangs of apprehension as you come to gullies and ditches, or a low hedge that lies directly in your path, and the first intimation you have that this machine you are on is not a motor car is when in some unaccountable manner you 'skip' the ditch and mysteriously avoid the hedge.

"Your machine hops up a little, then comes gently to earth again—skips a gully, skims a piece of rising ground, then suddenly the occasional jolting of the wheels beneath you cease. You have a sense of running smoothly and noiselessly over a perfect road—as indeed you are, for you are moving along a path of elastic air. Your speed seems enormous whilst you are flying low. The trees, the houses, the fields go racing past you at a bewildering rate. Then, as you mount higher and higher, the speed seems to slacken. The fields and the house-tops beneath you seem to move at a more stately pace, the horizon becomes more and more extending as the wind catches you. It is the world that moves, and I think that one of the joys of aviation is the sense that by this lever or that,

you can change the direction in which the world is running.

"You are flying north, and you turn. The obedient world changes the direction, and goes eastward. That one has a splendid sense of exhilaration is only natural.

"One has no fear. For myself, I am too occupied. There is the engine to listen to the planes to watch, every sense conscious or subconscious is employed.

"The only danger is that one's engines would stop, but that never worries me, for I could always glide down to safety. That is where the gliding experiments are so useful. The danger comes to the man who cannot glide down. If he were to 'flop' down, that is to say, come down straight, there would always be the danger that the machine would get out of hand, and would come down in a heap.

"I have heard aviators complain of the cold whilst flying, but I have never suffered. My experience is that it is not much colder in an aeroplane going at top speed than it is on a motor-car, and I find, too that the elevating planes break the force of the wind, and afford a certain amount of protection.

"All flying must be more or less self taught. One has just got to climb into one's machine and fly. Some people learn quickly, some seem as if they would never learn. Mr. Colemore, to whom I gave lessons, is an instance of the speed with which an enthusiast may master the art. I was in his machine running about the ground for exactly 39 minutes. Then I suggested that he should go up for his pilot's certificate. Without more ado he made three flights of three miles each!"



## Letters to the Editor

### Metlakatla and Sunday Trippers

To the Editor of Optimist,—Metlakatla is an Indian Village standing on Government Reserve land, and is therefore under control of the Indian Agent. Of late, there have been complaints as to the way in which the agent has exercised his authority towards trippers visiting us from Prince Rupert and Essington. I venture to think, however, that all right minded people, on knowing the circumstances, will not only condemn him but will commend him for his courage.

Amongst our numerous white visitors there is a very undesirable element. These are of two classes. One consists of those individuals whom George Eliot describes as being perpetually atheist—people who have no conception of pleasure apart from the whiskey bottle. Only last Sunday I happened to be on the wharf when a launch with such a party arrived. I think they were Norwegians. One man lay dead drunk on the deck and had to be carried below. Another needed assistance in walking up the wharf. All tucked whiskey bottles into their pockets on landing, and only left them behind by order of the Chief Councillor. People with so little self-control are none too well behaved when they are sober. When drunk, they are an unmitigated nuisance. Half a dozen of them would suffice to corrupt a whole Indian village. Surely we are right in endeavoring to protect ourselves.

Another class consists of those who have not even a nodding acquaintance with the Eighth Commandment. Not content with nose-gays of the numerous wayside flowers, they break into the Indians gardens and help themselves to both flowers and fruit. Only a Sunday or two ago, some such individuals entered a well-fenced grave enclosure inside the churchyard, and not only gathered the flowers from the grave, but dragged up several by the roots. One would hardly have supposed there were people about still in so elementary a stage of moral development. There is obviously only one way of dealing with them, and I personally am very grateful to the Indian Agent for his firm action.

I hasten to add that the foregoing remarks have no reference whatever to the large majority of our Sunday visitors. It is true that the influx of so many strangers considerably destroys the serenity of our Sunday. But their behaviour is irreproachable, and we are glad to see them enjoying themselves. It is to these that I would respectfully but earnestly appeal, to see that as far as possible the undesirables be prevented from joining their parties. It is easy to understand how harmful even a few vicious persons can be to an unexperienced and susceptible community such as ours. The missionary finds his work hard enough as it is. How much harder it becomes when the Indian can say:—"Why urge me to be a Christian as long as your own people are what they are?"

**The Boy Who Didn't Watch the Clock**

"From Sea to Sea" has been the title of many books and poems, but it has remained for one man, Charles Melville Hays, president of the Grand Trunk and Grand Trunk Pacific railways, to write that legend across the North American continent in a broad hand of oak and steel that even the Doukhobor and the stray dog will recognize when in a little while the whistle will shrill at the crossing and the trans-continental limited will thunder by on a new route from the Atlantic to the Pacific.

Mr. Hays was born on May 16th, 1856, at Rock Island, Ill., and had his initiation in railway work in the passenger department of the old Atlantic & Pacific railway at St. Louis, which he entered at the age of 17. It was not long after this—almost before he was old enough to vote—that Talmage, vice president and general manager of the Gould roads, picked him out of the passenger department to be his private secretary and confidential clerk. In this connection men tell a story that perhaps is the key to Mr. Hay's success.

Talmage knew just what sort of young fellow he wanted, and for some time had been looking about for him. One day he strolled into the passenger department just a little before lunch hour, and looked over the landscape. Half of the clerks in the office "rubbered" when the "boss" came in. Some of them were putting on their coats; some leaving for the wash-room; some consulting the clock; some were still busy. Among these last was young Hays, who seemed dead to the world, and Talmage, approaching him, inquired the time of day. The young man kept on figuring, and Talmage put a hand on his desk, repeating the question. Instantly Hays looked up, surprised to see the big chief at his elbow.

"I beg your pardon—were you speaking to me?" he asked.

"Merely inquired the time—that was all," said Talmage.

Hays glanced about the room, located the clock, and said:

"It's eleven-fifty."

"Thank you," said the general manager and vice president strolling out.

That conversation cost young Hays his job—in the passenger department—and put him under Talmage on the firing line where he could see the "big guns" in action. Nine years later he was assistant general manager, and while still in the thirties became a general manager full-fledged.

As far back as 1896, when Mr. Hays was general manager of the Grand Trunk, he dreamed of an extension that would give that railway a sea-to-sea route. However, being only general manager at that time, he was not in a position to put his plans into effect. Thereafter he went to the Southern Pacific, accepting the presidency of that road when it was under Collis P. Huntington. After Harriman took over the road, he returned to the Grand Trunk as vice president and general manager and upon his return he determined to carry his old plan into effect. Working to that end with the English and Canadian owners of the road, and coupling with this a campaign in the Canadian parliament, he succeeded in having his plans adopted and financed.

It is no small matter to plan, execute and complete a system of 3,600 miles of road, secure \$100,000,000 private capital, and get a government to supply an equal amount. Mr. Hays did not manage this Herculean task single-handed, yet it is due to his efforts that all obstacles were finally surmounted, and the line is now nearing completion. Millions of bushels of wheat were hauled this year over the prairie section between Edmonton and Winnipeg, where a new

outlet for the grain was greatly needed.

Since his return to the Grand Trunk, Mr. Hays has finished the double track from Chicago to Niagara Falls, and on to Montreal. He has changed the old Grand Trunk from its former position to one of the best railways in America. He has built another general office building in Montreal, elevated the tracks in Chicago, electrified the St. Clair tunnel, and is now building a handsome union station and a magnificent hotel, the Chateau Laurier, at the Canadian capital. Meanwhile, the gross earnings of the old system have increased 57 per cent, and the net earnings 60 per cent.

At the beginning of this year, Mr. Hays was made president of the Grand Trunk railway system, and is now at the head of all the Grand Trunks; and with his wide range of interests and the personal direction of the road, he is one of the busiest men in Canada today—*Humane Life*.

It will be interesting to know that Dr. J. B. Calkins was doctor for the Talmage road when Mr. Hays was confidential clerk to the vice-president. Dr. Calkins went home one day and told his son, J. M. Calkins, who is now associated with Westenhaver Bros., that Mr. Hays could write as fast as the vice president could talk. That set J. M. thinking and he decided that he would be a shorthand writer also. He studied the Graham system, the same as used by Hays, and when he accomplished it he took a position as Court stenographer and from that has worked along at different jobs until he landed in Prince Rupert a year or two ago, and he intends to remain. It was the fact that Chas. M. Hays could write as fast as a man could talk that started J. M. Calkins on the road to success.
