## PRINCE RUPERT MINING

ASSOCIATION OPENS TOMORROW  
FROM 11 TO 12

Will Have Premises in the Christiansen-Brandt Building—Business Prospects Very Bright—Prominent Men are Connected.

To-morrow morning at 11 o'clock the Prince Rupert Mining Association will open its doors to the public for the first time. The Association has secured quarters in the Christiansen-Brandt block on Third Avenue. These premises are central, large, well-lighted and ideal for the purpose intended. The Prince Rupert Mining Association was the first exchange organized, and connected with it are many of the most important brokers, mining and real estate men in the city, and all are active and enthusiastic in the city's interests. They are anxious to get started in the business of the mining exchange, and business promises to be brisk from the opening. The mining companies are listing their stocks with this association and everything looks rosy now. The association is connected with the Vancouver Exchange and have arranged a code for handling the daily closing prices. This will be a great advantage and will do much to make Prince Rupert a centre for the mining men.

### Northwest Land Registration.

Ottawa, May 28.—The Northwest Territories as described in the Land Titles act has been created into a land registration district. The place of registry of titles is Ottawa.

### Manitoba Elections July 14.

Brandon, June 2.—T. C. Morris, the Liberal leader, left this morning on an automobile trip to Rivers and northern points. It is stated here today that the elections will be July 14 or 15 and there is very noticeable activity in political circles.

### TRIED TO "DUCK" EDITOR.

Englishmen Who Resented Article in Penticton Paper Are Fined.

Penticton, June 2.—Several Englishmen who took exception to an editorial in The Penticton Press on the subject of "Mock Loyalty", entered the office of the newspaper Monday evening and requested the editor, Mr. W. J. Clement, to apologize. On his refusal to do so he was seized and preparations were made to "duck" him in a frog pond near by. Several residents came to the editor's assistance, and a fight followed. The editor escaped with wet feet while several of his assailants were "ducked." The rioters were fined \$13 each in the Police Court today.

### WINNER OF THE DERBY.

Race Between Lemberg, Neil Gow and Greenback.

Epsom Downs, June 1.—The 131st Derby of \$35,000 for three-year olds, distance about one mile and a half the classic of the English turf, was won to-day by Mr. Fairrier's Lemberg. Sir John Thursby's Greenback was second and P. Cunliffe's Charles O'Malley third. Lord Rosebery's Neil Gow finished fourth. Seventeen horses started.

From the start the race was between the four horses named Lemberg winning

by a neck in a position gained but a few yards from the post.

Neil Gow behaved badly at the post, delaying the start for ten minutes, but the field finally go away in good shape. Greenback settled down in the lead with two favorites, Lemberg and Neil Gow second and fourth respectively. There was little change of positions until the horses were close at home, when Lemberg passed Greenback and maintained a bare lead to the finish. Two lengths separated Greenback and Charles O'Malley. Neil Gow was close up in the first flight. Betting was 7 to 4 against Lemberg and 33 to 1 against Charles O'Malley. The time was 2:35 1-5 seconds, which is a record for the derby. There were 15 starters.

### DIVORCE IS GRANTED.

Wife of Aide-de-camp to Earl Grey is Given Her Freedom.

New York, May 28.—An interlocutory of decree of divorce was granted in the Supreme Court to Mrs. Jeanette Newton from Montague Newton, who is described as an aide-de-camp to Earl Grey, governor-general of Canada. Notice of the suit was sent to him, she asserted, at the Government House in Ottawa. The suit was brought on statutory grounds. Mrs. Newton charges that her husband was arrested and sentenced to prison in London for deserting her.

Cable messages from London on Nov. 19, 1907, told of the sentencing of Montague Newton to twenty months' imprisonment for a "conspiracy to cheat and defraud." Sir Charles Lewis, a prominent attorney, caused Newton's arrest on charges of attempting to use his firm's name in an alleged blackmailing scheme.

### HAS BRAND NEW NOSE

Skin From Man's Leg Used to Replace Missing Member.

Indianapolis, May, 28.—Henry Bond, whose nose was sliced off in a fight a month ago, appeared in the police court wearing a very serviceable nose that had been cut from his leg and spliced on in place of the missing member.

Bond has been in the city hospital since the fight, and the surgeons arranged the substitute by grafting skin from Bond's own leg. The result of their work is satisfactory and according to all who saw him, he now has a handsome nose.

### Reception of Prince Rupert

The special committee of the Publicity Club on the reception of the steamer Prince Rupert held a meeting last night in the new rooms of the Mining Association, Christiansen Block, and discussed important details. As it is desired to make the occasion an important event the report of the committee will be made to a full general meeting of the club to be held in McIntyre hall on Thursday evening. To this every booster for Prince Rupert city is invited, whether a member or not.

### Police Court.

A. Carboni, an Italian, had a night's lodging in the police cells and yesterday he was assessed \$15 and costs by Magistrate McMullen. It is expensive boarding with the government but a drunk and disorderly has no kick coming. He paid the fine and got away.

Josiah Ryan, a drunken Indian, was found guilty and he was remanded until two o'clock for sentence.

## SAIL FOR THE BIG FIGHT

AUSTRALIA SENDS A CARGO OF ACCOMPLISHED BRUISERS

New South Wales Defeated Old England at Professional Football by Twenty-Seven to Twenty-Forty Thousand Present.

Sydney, Australia, June 5 (delayed in transmission)—The Steamship Marama sailed to-day and former world's champions Fitzsimmons and Tommy Burns, and a big crowd of sports are coming on her for the Jeffries-Johnson fight. Other fistic celebrities of the party are Bill Lang, heavyweight champion of Australia; Unholz, the Boer; Hugh D. McIntosh, the fight promoter, and the sporting editors of several Australian papers, and Milward, manager of the Pacific Cable.

The second professional rugby match, New South Wales versus England, was won by the former by twenty-seven points to twenty. Forty thousand people saw the game. The game has a tendency to popularize Northern Union rules and professional football generally. These rules differ from Rugby Union considerably. There are thirteen men instead of fifteen and six forwards instead of eight.

### More Progress

### WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC.

Startling Evidence as to Seattle and Alaska.

New York, May 31.—Witnesses before the federal grand jury are showing up a more extensive traffic in white slaves from this place than was thought possible.

They asserted that two of the best markets for this class of women were Seattle and Alaska. Seattle was considered the clearing house for Alaska and the "dealers" in the latter place left standing orders with procurers here for women from the old countries who were still ignorant of the ways of the country. One witness claimed that most of the importations for Alaska came from abroad. The investigations is leading into new and unexpected paths and will likely include the names of men considered above dealing in such traffic.

### MANY NEW BUILDINGS.

Large Business Blocks to Meet Expansion of Business.

All these additions to the dock and warehouse accommodations at the port are to meet the demands of business men who are constantly increasing their own store and warehouse facilities. Some of them have contracted for very large buildings, as for instance:

Kelly Douglas Supply Co., is building a seven-story store and warehouse,

with elevator service and all modern conveniences. The building will be 180 feet by 50.

The J. Piercy, Morris Co., is building a wholesale dry goods house of very much the same design, that will be 50 feet by 170.

Stewart & Mobley are building a wholesale grocery of the same dimensions as the Piercy, Morris building.

P. Burns & Co., have in hand a cold storage plant that will occupy 75 feet by 180.

The Westholm Lumber company have a four story hotel of cement in course of construction, and then there are any number of other new buildings projected and in course of construction Building is going on all over the city.

### TOMB FOR INDIAN CHIEF.

Imposing Memorial to Be Erected to Chief Joe Capilano.

North Vancouver, May 28.—An imposing tomb is to be erected by the Coast Indians over the last resting place of Chief Joe Capilano. The building will be twelve by ten feet on the ground and eleven feet in height. It will be built entirely of rock-faced British Columbia granite. The entrance will consist of large double bronze doors, and two leaded glass windows will be inserted close under the eaves.

## BRITISH COLUMBIA SAILED

WILL REACH PRINCE RUPERT IN A DAY OR TWO.

Capt. Foellmer in Charge—Has Full Cargo for Prince Rupert and Skeena River Ports.

Vancouver, June 7—Another new steamer for the north has sailed from here. It was the British Columbia, the new freighter of the Coast Steamship Co. She carried a cargo for the Skeena River ports and Prince Rupert. Capt. Foellmer, formerly of the Celtic is in charge of her, and he is justly proud of his new command. The British Columbia was purchased by Mr. W. D. Whitehead in Hull, England, last winter. Mr. Whitehead looked over many craft and he picked on this boat as the proper one for the British Columbia coast trade. Coast marine men compliment him on his judgment. The British Columbia is particularly fitted for the trade. She is a new boat with large holds and facilities for handling cargoes rapidly and economically. Her equipment is modern in every respect and the officers and crew have comfortable and cosy quarters.

The British Columbia will make tri-monthly trips and the Celtic will alternate with a similar schedule.

### ORGANIZING SYNDICATE.

Nineteen Claims in the Bear River District Secured.

Another mining syndicate is being organized in Prince Rupert now to handle nineteen valuable claims on the Bear river which are in the heart of the richest ore-bearing mines in the Portland Canal district. These mines are very promising, and the syndicate will be composed mostly of local men.

Geo. W. Arnott arrived home from Stewart yesterday afternoon, where he completed arrangements for taking over the claims. There are nineteen in number. They are in two groups. One is just across the river from the railway, and the other is about ten or twelve miles back, but they have easy access over a trail.

The claims in these two groups are: Crown, Royal, Scotia, Melford, Iroquois, Sioux, Rose, Royal American, Britisher, Ivanho, Highlander, Shamrock and Thistle.

The other group are: Homestake, War Eagle, Elkhorn, Comstock, Verna and Nest Egg.

The claims are very centrally located and they have stood all the tests made and in no case have they showed less than 5 per cent. On one side is the Red Cliff Mining Co. and the International group, and on the other side are the Bear River Canyon's claims, the Dreadnaught group and the Bitter Creek Development Co.'s mines.

These claims are right on the leads, and there is every indication of great value. The option has been secured at a very reasonable figure, and the shareholders will get in for little money, one of the chief features of a successful proposition.

The organization of the syndicate will be completed to-day, and a company will then be floated at once. Mr. Arnott and his friends are enthusiastic over their success in securing these two groups, and they stand to make a lot of money. Almost anything in that district is good, and especially when it is so centrally located and so close to the rich producing mines. **QUEEN CHARLOTTE GOLD.**

First Brick Sent to Assay Office From Moresby.

Queen Charlotte Islands have sent their first gold brick to the Dominion assay office Vancouver and the indications are that many others will soon follow. The brick represented a one day's run of a five stamp will recently installed at the Early Bird free milling group on the west coast of Moresby Island. Its value is \$400.

The property was acquired three years ago by Messrs. John McLellan, a graduate of the London School of Mines, and Mr. F. J. Bourne, M. E., of Cobalt, Ont. Development consists of 100-foot shaft and 250 feet of drifting.

The shaft was sunk on a two-inch stringer which has now widened out in the lower workings to six inches. In places the vein gives phenomenal values, the gold literally encrusting the country rock. The vein has also been exposed on the surface for a distance of 250 feet.

Mr. Bourne, stated while in Vancouver that he regarded the property as a promising one but by no means a big proposition. The gold brick represented the result of one day's run of ore. If development work shows the vein to widen at depth the plant will be enlarged. This will take several months to determine. The property was originally operated by the Hudson Bay Company in the late fifties when it is claimed that \$80,000 in gold was extracted from a rich pocket near the surface. The hole is still visible. There are also a number of undeveloped free-milling claims in the same camp.

Mr. Bourne, who spoke very conservatively, is regarded as a great authority on mill practice. He has had a wide experience in South Africa and in the west. He built the Northern Custom concentrator at Cobalt and for several years was one of the experts in the employ of Allis-Chalmers Co., of Chicago. Mr. Bourne expects to re-visit the Queen Charlotte Islands

in August. He is very optimistic about the future of the mining industry up there.

**Gold Creek Mines.**

The new mining company incorporated May 28th to operate lode and placer mines in northern British Columbia, was incorporated under the name of Inland Mines Limited. This company is capitalized at \$100,000, divided into 10,000 shares, par value \$10 each. The directors are Chas. A. Giggey, Wm. D. Munroe, Enoch R. L. Jones, Jennie M. Giggey and Harold M. Wood. Company's officers: Wm. D. Munroe, president; Chas. A. Giggey, vice-president and manager; Harold M. Wood, treasurer; and Enoch R. L. Jones, secretary.

The company will engage in both lode and placer mining, its first venture being to take over and develop the Palawan and Agutaya groups of placer claims up Gold creek.—*Big Canon Weekly.*
