GRAND JURY HAS THROWN OUT CASE

NO BILL BROUGHT IN AT ASSIZES IN CHARGES AGAINST OFFICIALS

Chief Inspector Graham And Managing Director Tonkin Free.

Nanaimo, Oct. 26.—The Grand Jury, after deliberation at the Assizes here today, brought in "no bill" in the case of Rex vs. Graham and Rex vs. Tonkin. These cases had to do with the disaster in the South Wellington mine last February.

The defendants were Chief Inspector Graham, of the Department of Mines of the province, and J. P. Tonkin, Managing Director of the Pacific Coast Coal Co., operating the mines.

It will be remembered that Mr. Justice Murphy, who acted as a commission to inquire into the disaster, reflected upon the course of these two men. Following that the Attorney-General of the Province, Hon. W. J. Bowser, had them indicted on charges of manslaughter, and the case was set down for hearing at the Nanaimo Assizes.

The Grand Jury has found the cases not sufficient upon which to carry them to trial to the Petit Jury.

GERMANS CONDEMN MORE TO DEATH

ATTEMPT TO SPREAD TERROR AMONG THOSE OPPOSED TO THEM

Thirty-four Additional Sentences Pronounced At Liege.

Amsterdam, Oct. 26.—Thirty-four additional death sentences against persons charged with espionage or with treason have been pronounced by German courts martial at Liege. The Germans are evidently seeking to spread terror among their enemies.

THE KAISER IS PREPARING TERMS FOR PEACE OFFER

London, Oct. 26.—It is reported that Prince Von Buelow, the ex-Chancellor of Germany, will shortly submit to President Wilson and King Alfonso of Spain, the conditions under which Germany will discuss terms of peace.

Germans Airmen In Fight With French Was Taken Prisoners

Paris, Oct. 26.—An official report received today says one of our aeroplane pilots gave chase at North Dormans to an enemy aeroplane which we attacked at short range. The German aeroplane was hit in several places by bullets, but was able to make a landing near Jaulgonne. Two officers of the German air craft were taken prisoners. This was accomplished just at the moment when they were attempting to destroy their machine.

The machine remains intact in our hands, they being prevented from destroying it.

FIGHTING AGAIN ON BELGIAN FRONT

GERMAN ARTILLERY WAS ACTIVE YESTERDAY SOUTH OF NIEUPORT

Reply Made By Allies—No Infantry Action Took Place.

Belgium, Oct. 26.—An official report says, after a quiet night the artillery of the enemy bombarded quite violently the district south of Nieuport, Perbyse and Quikirke. We replied vigorously. There was no infantry action.

ANOTHER MIX IN SITUATION FOR GREEK GOVERNMENT

Athens, Oct. 26.—A crisis has occurred again in the Greek Cabinet, and Premier Zaimis has resigned, on being reminded by ex-Premier Venizelos that the government depends largely upon the control of a large number of the opposition.

Serbian Have Recaptured Velles In Hard Fight

Athens, Oct. 26.—The Serbians have re-captured the town of Velles, on the railroad east of Uskup, after desperate fighting.

Made Small Advance.

The Bulgars in Uskup hold the Nish-Saloniki railroad to Varna, a distance of fifty miles. The French state that the Teutons have advanced less than twelve miles into Serbia from the crossing of the Danube.

British In Balkans.

Saloniki, Oct. 26.—A brigade of British troops has left for Dorian to prepare for an advance on Strumitza in conjunction with a French movement. Dorian is forty miles northwest of Saloniki.

BRAVE BRITISH WOMAN'S DEATH

HOW MISS CAVELL THE NURSE WAS DONE TO DEATH BY GERMANS

Indignation Has Been Aroused In Britain Over The Crime.

The full report of the circumstances of the condemnation and execution of Miss Edith Cavell, the English woman, head of a training school in Brussels, for helping English, French and Belgian soldiers to escape from Belgium, made by Brand Whitlock, the American Minister at Brussels, to Walter Page, the American Ambassador at London, has been issued by the British Government.

How the secretary of the American legation, Hugh S. Gibson, sought out the German Governor, Von der Lancken, late at night, before the execution, and, with the Spanish Minister, pleaded with the governor and the German officers for the English woman's life, is graphically related in a memorandum from Mr. Gibson. This document makes reference to an apparent lack of good faith on the part of the German authorities in failing to keep their promises to inform the American minister fully of the trial and sentence.

The memorial service for Miss Cavell in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, which was meant to be an unobtrusive tribute, is developing national proportions. Premier Asquith and other members of the Cabinet have announced their intention of being

present at St. Paul's Cathedral on Friday when the service will be held and public bodies and the leading hospitals throughout the country will send delegations.

The Amsterdam Telegraaf states that when the Germans executed the French woman Mlle. Louise Fernie at Liege a fortnight ago, the firing party purposely aimed low and she was hit in the legs. An officer then shot her through the head with his revolver.

The Telegraaf says the same thing happened in Miss Cavell's case. She was fired at by a party of twelve, but only one bullet touched her and that did not kill her. It was after this that the officer of the firing party drew a revolver and, putting it to her ear, fired. The priest present at the execution was overcome with horror and is now suffering from a nervous breakdown.

Ignominiously buried near the prison of St. Giles, where she was done to death, the body of England's martyred nurse, Edith Cavell, will lie until such time as the German authorities see fit to give her friends permission to remove it and bestow it in the sacred soil of the country for which she perished.

Eyes glistened throughout Great Britain as the touching story, told by the Rev. Mr. Gahan, of Miss Cavell's last hours, was pursued in the columns of the daily papers. Mr. Gahan was admitted to the prison on the evening before the execution.

He writes: "To my astonishment and relief I found my friend perfectly calm and resigned, but this could not lessen the tenderness and intensity of feeling on either part during that last interview of almost an hour.

"She said that she wished all her friends to know that she willingly gave her life for her country and said:

"I have no fear nor shrinking. I have seen death so often that it is not strange or fearful to me."

"She further said: 'I thank God for this ten weeks of quiet before the end. My life has always been hurried and full of difficulties; this time the rest has been a great mercy. They have all been very kind to me here. But this I would say, standing as I do in view of God and eternity: I have no hatred or bitterness towards anyone.'

"We partook of Holy Communion together, and she received the Gospel message of consolation with all her heart. At the close of the little service I began to repeat the words 'Abide With Me,' and she joined softly in the end.

"We sat quietly talking until it was time for me to go. She gave me parting messages for relations and friends. She spoke of her soul's needs at the moment and she received assurance of God's words as only a Christian can do.

"Then I said good-bye, and she smiled and said 'We shall meet again.' "A German military chaplain was with her at the end and afterward gave her a Christian burial. He told me: "She was brave and bright to the last. She professed her Christian faith and she was glad to die for her country. She died like a heroine."

The Daily Telegraph, with a donation of 1,000 shillings (\$250) has started a shilling fund to provide a memorial statue to Miss Edith Cavell. Sir George J. Frampton, the sculptor, has promised to execute the statue as a "labor of love."

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining rights of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the right applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

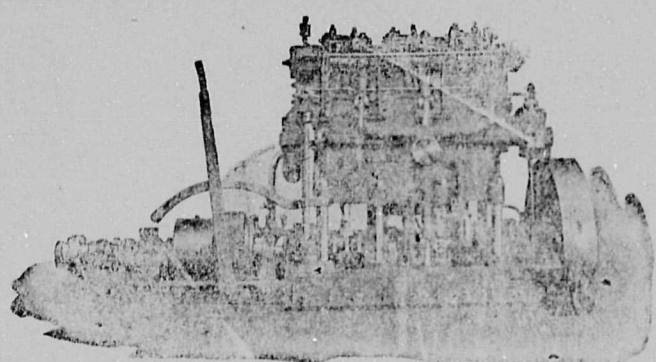

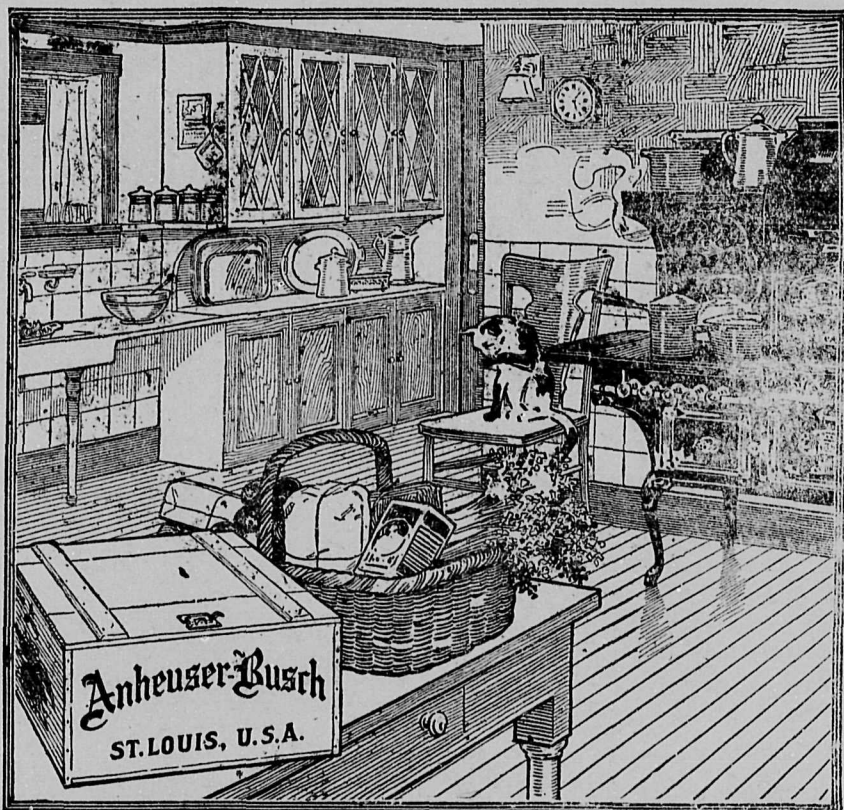

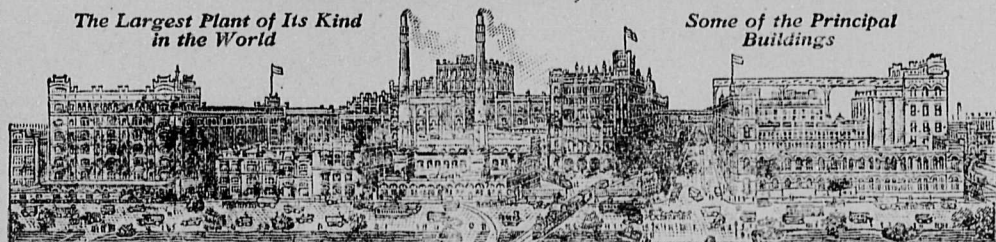
