

ITALIAN SQUADRON SAIL UNDER SEALED ORDERS FOUR GERMAN STEAMERS TORPEDOED IN BALTIC The German Forces Failed In Attack East Of Rheims

German Attack East Of Rheims Completely Failed

Paris, Oct. 19.—An official report says on the east of Rheims the enemy attacked with a strong force, on a front of ten kilometers, between La-pompelle and Presnes. The attack ended in a complete check.

This attack had been most carefully prepared, it being preceded by a prolonged bombardment by artillery, with the employment of suffocating shells and banks of Chlorine gas. The infantry of the enemy succeeded at first in penetrating some parts of our trench of the first line,

but were almost completely driven out by immediate counter attacks.

In the afternoon an energetic counter offensive resulted in the expulsion of the last of the enemy's troops, who were entirely thrown back into the trenches which they had left. The German infantry suffered heavy losses in this fight.

On the rest of the front there have been artillery engagements. In the Vosges we exploded two small mines which shattered the enemy's mine works.

Masset, Oct. 19.—John Parks, an old resident of Massett Inlet, disposed of his farm at Cape Fife, to Mr. Carlwey, formerly of Lillooet and left on the last steamer for Granby mine, where he will be employed for some time.

The Japanese found marooned on the north end of Graham Island and taken to Prince Rupert, were endeavoring to make their way to Naden Harbor, where a number of their countrymen reside. Three of the nine shipwrecked men improvised a boat from a log and paddled over to Langara Island, where the lighthouse keeper, Mr. Forsyth found them and provided the men with the necessaries of life. The nine Japanese were lost on the islands for two months, subsisting on shell fish and vegetables from the gardens of the Indians.

CLOSING DOWN FOR THE WINTER

MANAGER BEATON OF GEORGIA
RIVER MINES HAS GONE
SOUTH

The Properties Look Exceedingly
Well According To
Report.

Manager Beaton, of the Georgia River mines near Stewart, passed through here a few days ago on his way south. Work is being suspended for the season at the property.

Considerable interest is being shown by mining men in the Georgia River Mining Company, which has its property in the Portland Canal Mining Division in this province. The company owns twelve claims, and the improvements thereon, covering about five hundred acres. C. H. Dickie, of Duncan, is the managing director of the concern, while E. F. Miller is the secretary.

The property is at present reached by trail about four miles in length from a camp on the Portland Canal six miles south from Stewart. The trail crosses a mountain four thousand feet high, and then descends one thousand feet to the camp at the workings. A trail from the mouth of Georgia River to the mine is now in course of construction.

The history of the location may be very briefly told. Two prospectors, Hume and Jarvis, were looking for showing on the side hill in September, 1910. Finding favorable indications near the top, they crossed to the Georgia River side. Not far below the top several veins were located and staked. Samples of the ore taken out were carried to Stewart, and assayed about eight ounces per ton in gold.

W. J. Elmesdorf, the Seattle mining engineer, reports very favorably on the claims, and adds that the most important necessity is the provision of adequate transportation.

ANOTHER BODY OF CANADIANS LAND

OVER ONE THOUSAND TROOPS
ARRIVED BY THE MISSANABIE
YESTERDAY

How Canada's Army Is Now Distributed In The Old Land.

Montreal, Oct. 19.—The Canadian Pacific liner Missanabie has arrived in England with 1,174 Canadian troops aboard.

These will be added to the Canadian troops in training in England, from which many have been drawn lately for the front.

Particulars of the composition of the new Canadian corps of troops which have been added to the two Canadian divisions at the front shows that the new corps of troops will total about 10,000 men and bring the Canadian forces at the front up to the very considerable total of nearly 60,000.

The corps troops commanded by Brigadier-General Mercer, of Toronto, are composed as follows:

Canadian cavalry brigade with signal troops of about 15,000 men.

Field engineer troop of about 600 men.

Brigade of Royal Canadian Horse Artillery, about 1,700 men.

First and second brigades Mounted Rifles, about 3,200 men.

Royal Canadian Regiment, 1,000 men.

Forty-second Montreal Highlanders, 49th Edmonton Battalion, and Princess Patricia's, about 4,000 men.

Also a troop company of engineers and signal unit Army Service Corps and supply and ammunition column.

In addition to the 60,000 men now at the front, upwards of 25,000 men are in training in England, while there are over 32,000 men in Canada.

THOMAS SCHEMES FOR THE NORTH

REPRESENTATIVE OF THESE INTERESTS TELL WHAT IS IN VIEW

Steamers Are To Ply On The Mackenzie River And Other Routes.

Charles F. Law, Canadian representative of the D. A. Thomas interests, has returned to the coast from Peace River Crossing, where he has been spending the past two months looking after the development work being carried on in the north for the Thomas interests.

Mr. Law reports that a steamer which is being built at Peace River Crossing to ply between Hudson's Hope and Vermilion Chutes is now nearing completion. It is proposed to build another steamer next year for service on the Peace between Vermilion Chutes and Smith's Rapids. By the year 1917 it is proposed to put another steamer on the northern waters that will ply between Vermilion Chutes and Herschel Island at the mouth of the Mackenzie River. Electric car lines are to be built at Vermilion Chutes and Smith's Rapids. The company proposes to build the line at the former place next year, the right of way having been cleared this year.

ONLY WAY OF PEACE.

In the opinion of Prof. George Trumbull Ladd, of Yale, there is only one possible way in which peace can come to the earth, and that is by the absolute overthrow of Germany, states the Mail and Empire. Writing in the New York Times he says: "The triumph of the Teutonic allies, or even a drawn battle between the two mighty forces ranged on the two sides of the supreme issue, would not bring peace to Europe or peace to the United States, or peace and good-will among the nations of the earth. For the temporary defeat or half-defeat of the cause of independent nationalism and of democratic representative government cannot avail for their being permanently defeated. The cause of an autocracy supported by an armed force under the control of a Divinely appointed war lord cannot be ultimately in the ascendancy. There will be war in the heaven and war on the earth until this supreme issue is settled in the interests of principles of which one of the wise Greek tragedians sang centuries ago: "They never shall sink to slumber in oblivion A power of God is there untouched by time."

Prof. Ladd believes that the people of the United States have not yet thoroughly grasped the fact that the Allies are fighting for exactly those principles to which the United States was dedicated. They are fighting for government of the people for the people by the people. They are waging war against the defenders of the Divine right of kings.

If the theory of the Divine right of the Kaiser to do whatever he pleased with the power with which he is invested, and answer to no one but God for his actions, were to triumph in Europe, how long would it be before an effort would be made to extend the theory to other parts of the world?

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining rights of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the right applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

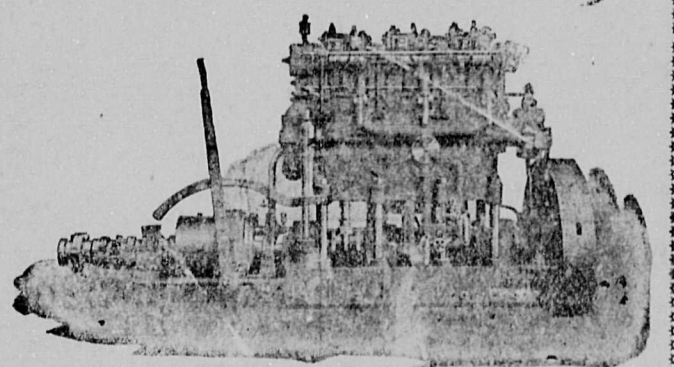
