Pulverized coal as a substitute for oil fuel has been demonstrated to be a safer and a cleaner form of fuel, according to R. C. Campbell-Johnson. the well known mining and metallurgical engineer of Vancouver.

The new method has gone beyond the experimental stage in bringing coal into competition with oil in regard to cost. The coal is crushed as fine as sawdust with compressed air and it can be fed through the same nozzles that are now used for oil burners and no renewals will be necessary.


