

The Allied Forces Pierced German Lines On The Somme Liberals Have 36 Seats, Conservative 3 And Doubtful 8

Greek Forces Surrender The Town Of Kavala To Attacking Turks

Athens, Sept. 15.—The British Legation reported yesterday that the Greeks had surrendered to Bulgaria the last forst defending Kavala to the Turks. Entente warships have removed 1,500 Greek soldiers to Thasos. Rioting is reported at Kavala. Houses and shops have been pillaged and the lives and property of Americans are endangered. The British Legation informed the American Minister at Droppere. The Turks massacred several citizens when the Greek garrison withdrew. The Entente Powers are dissatisfied with the programme of Dimitracopolis, whose acceptance of the premiership was based on the complete authority and control of the National policy, which permits of the abandonment of the formation cabinet.

AUSTRIAN OFFICERS NEVER REALIZED RUMANIA'S POWER

London, Sept. 15.—Premier Tisza, on the resumption of the debate in the House of Representatives of the Austrian and Hungarian Parliaments, admitted that he had never realized that Rumania was properly ready for war, up to the time she joined the Allies. He believed that the entrance of Rumania into Bulgaria, coupled with the Bulgarian counter attacks, will result in loss to the Rumanian alliance.

TWO STEAMERS ARE DESTROYED

HARRISON LINER AND PACIFIC
COAST COMPANY'S STEAMERS
HAVE BEEN LOST

Crews Of The Boats Were Saved, Also
A Number Of Passengers
Were Rescued.

Marshfield, Ore., Sept. 15.—Fire has completely destroyed the Pacific Coast Company's steamer Congress. Two hundred and fifty-three passengers and 170 of the crew were saved.

London, Sept. 15.—The Harrison liner Counsellor, bound from Vancouver to Liverpool, has been sunk. The crew were saved.

BRIDGE COMPANY BEARS ALL LOSS AND TO REBUILD

Ottawa, Sept. 15.—The Government here has received a communication from the St. Lawrence Bridge Company stating that the company takes full responsibility for the failure of the work of connecting the two cantilevers of the Quebec bridge with the central span and for the loss of the big span. The company states that it will bear all the loss and that it will commence on a new span at an early date. It will thus be unnecessary for the Government to hold any investigation.

Explain The Cause.

Montreal, Sept. 15.—Construction of a new centre span for the Quebec bridge will be continued at once along exactly the same lines as before the catastrophe on Monday. Only one change is to be made in the arrangements for the new span and that is members of rolled steel will be used in place of castings in the hoisting apparatus. This was announced by the St. Lawrence Bridge Company, Limited.

Officials of the bridge company declared that a casting on the hoisting apparatus at the southwest corner gave way allowing the corner of the span to fall. The twisting strain then proved too much for the rest of the holding apparatus and the span went down, turning on its side towards up stream as it fell.

ATLIN DISTRICT STILL IN DOUBT AT TO MEMBER

Anxox, Sept. 15.—The latest returns give F. Mobley a majority of six over W. X. Macdonald. It is reported that W. X. Macdonald will finally be returned to office. A number of places are yet to be heard from.

French Have Pierced The German Lines At Bouchavesnes

Paris, Sept. 15.—The French forces, after desperate fighting, pierced the German lines at the village of Bouchavesnes. The village was captured and hand to hand fighting indulged in, the Teuton troops offering a stubborn resistance. The enemy's defensive organization is now separated.

The day before the French captured a small village in the region of Combles, and they also took by assault six hundred yards east of the road from Peronne to Bapaume. Progress was also made on the Verdun front in the northern part of Vaux-Chapitre Wood.

Since the commencement of the offensive on the western front the British and French troops on the Somme and at Verdun have captured 34,000 prisoners, 727 guns, and much ammunition.

FIRST STONE SHIP TRAVELS THE SEAS

Built Of Concrete And Steel And Is
Guaranteed To Resist
Damage.

Christiania (via London) Sept. 15.—A new type of ship has arrived here from the ship yards of Christianiafjord. The ship, which resembles a huge barge, is constructed entirely of concrete, except for the ribs, which are steel and is the first stone vessel ever floated. It is said that the hull will resist damage better than steel or wood, and that the ship is therefore safer.

Christian Science Correspondent Answers Prince Rupert Critic

Mr. Editor,—

Your correspondent in what he terms "Criticism of Christian Science" takes strong objection to Prof. H. S. Hering regarding the statements he made of the Kinetic Nature of Matter. These were plainly stated to be the viewpoint of the physical sciences; consequently the criticism is leveled not against Christian Science, but against the research of the physicists of the present day. Sir William Crookes before the Royal Society read a paper on "Matter is but a Mode of Motion," and more recently he stated: "For nearly a century men who devote themselves to science have been dreaming of atoms, molecules, ultra-mundane particles and speculating as to the origin of matter; and now today they have got so far as to admit the possibility of solving the chemical elements into simpler forms of matter or even of refining them altogether into ethereal vibration or electrical energy."

Prof. Tait says: "We do not know, and are probably incapable of discovering what matter is," and again, "the discovery of the ultimate nature of matter is probably beyond the range of human intelligence."

W. S. Duncan says: "We break up a body into fragments, particles, molecules and atoms. Finally we break up atoms into electrons in which the material nucleus, if any, has a sinecure. May we not justifiably conclude that there is no material nucleus? We are forced, indeed, to believe there is no matter, considered as a substance, only the ether plus energy, and that all energy is fundamentally electric or electro-magnetic." Chambers Encyclopedia gives very concise evidence along the same lines.

In Science and Health, page 209, Mrs. Eddy says: "Material substances or mundane formations, astronomical calculations, and all the paraphernalia of speculative theories, based on the hypothesis of material law of life and intelligence resident in matter, will ultimately vanish, swallowed up in infinite calculus of Spirit."

The latest researches in the phenomena of matter are steadily pointing to the wisdom of these words. The lecturer drew a definite line between what your correspondent calls a logical conclusion and Spiritual origin. The Spiritual creation, as contained in the First Chapter of Genesis, is a definite statement regarding all that God made; this creation, we are informed, was perfect and complete, matter is not accorded a place either by statement or hypothesis.

matter, as given by the best authorities of the day, was presented; also a plain statement of the origin of man, God's idea, was also made, and your correspondent would wish to argue matter into Spirit. Paul deals very plainly with this wisdom, which he defines as "foolishness with God." There follows a very lengthy plea for the reality of sin, sickness and disease, it would be presumption on my part to reply in the length of detail invited by precedence. The lecturer said nothing regarding these states of the human consciousness, except what is very apparent truth to all who carefully study his remarks.

God, the First and Only Cause, made all that was made; it was good; therefore it contained nothing that was sick, sinful and diseased. God is omnipotent, there is nor can be no other power. This is "Our Father which art in Heaven." The man He created enjoys only the heritage contained in Genesis 1: 26, 27, Christian Scientists do not deny that sin, and sickness with all their trail of error are very rife in the world, it is a very appalling condition and as representatives of the Gospel which Christ Jesus preached and lived, Christian Scientists are pointing out the Truth; which will destroy this condition of unreality, falsity and opposition to God and his spiritual creation. Your correspondent takes as his basis the material, and everything which he sees is as real as the thought which made it and will perish in the dust of its origin. "The sinking of the Titanic as a myth, or the terror of the present war as an impossibility." In Science and Health, page 96, we read: "The material world is even now becoming the arena for conflicting forces. On one side there will be discord and dismay; on the other side there will be Science and peace. The breaking up of material beliefs may seem to be famine and pestilence, want and woe, sin, sickness, and death, which assume new phases until their nothingness appears. These disturbances will continue until the end of error, when all discord will be swallowed up in spiritual Truth." These atrocities are not, neither could they be the outcome of God's law, for God is Love; and as the parable of the prodigal son revealed, the Father's love is ever awaiting to be outpoured to suffering humanity, suffering not as the decree of this loving Father, but as a result of the lust and imagination, of enmity against the loving Father's protection. Neither war nor its attributes have place in the spiritual conception and Christ Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil. Did Jesus say there was no sin? He knew there was; but he also knew its unreality as a product of his Father, and he said of the thought which denied him, "Why do ye not understand my speech? Even because ye cannot hear my word. Ye are of your father, the devil and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh of a lie he speaketh of his own; for he is a liar, and the father of it."

Prof. Hering did not attack any other method of healing, but he did make plain the difference between the truth of our being, God's law, and the commandments of the Master; which is the whole of Christian Science, and other methods which are so frequently spoken of as Christian Science, or along the same lines. Your correspondent says: "Human Mind and Divine Mind are no doubt one in kind and are supreme over all other laws of nature." Christian Science says, Mind is God; Infinite; which according to dictionary phrase is, Unlimited in power, capacity, knowledge or excellence; inconceivably and immeasurably great. Mrs. Eddy says, Science and Health, page 252: "Human ignorance of Mind and of the recuperative energies of Truth occasions the only skepticism regarding the pathology and theology of Christian Science. When false human beliefs learn even a little of their own falsity, they begin to disappear." The lecturer erected no high fence around his presentation, neither debared any other interpretation of the truth. He repeated the undying promise of the living Christ, "Ye shall know the Truth, and the Truth shall make you free."

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the right applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

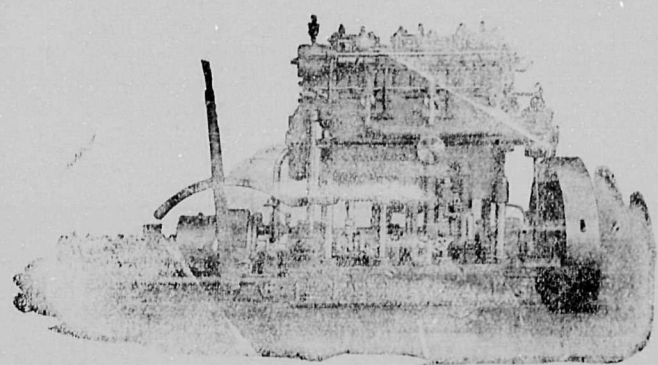
