Aviators Play Part in the Fighting

Berlin, July 4.—Military expert Major Mohart admits the arrival of the critical moment and declares Britain is the saviour of the Allies. He recognizes that the tremendous opposition seriously affects Germany's anticipations.

Panic in Berlin

Zurich, July 4.—The Germans declare the British asphyxiating gas is the most deadly yet employed. The steady advance of the Allies is producing a panic in Berlin.

Allied Aviators Active

London, July 4.—Despatches today from the French front say an immense number of French and British aviators are continuously directing the gun-fire enabling the Allies to smash enemy locations and necessitating that the Germans remain deeply entrenched. Fifteen inch shells are required to dislodge them.

The British new guns absolutely outclass the German and Austrian forty-two inch centimeter type and abundance of ammunition permits a continued offensive.

Good News Coming

Col. Repington, representing the London Times, announces that perfect British and French co-operation is responsible for the successful issues and credits the Belgians with assisting in the preliminary bombardment, hampering the Germans. He states that most encouraging information is coming concerning Russian victories.

London, July 4.—Intense enthusiasm for the Allied victories is prevailing in London. Thousands surround the stations and approaches cheering the arrival of trains carrying the wounded in Saturday's fighting.

London, July 4.—The remainder of the enemy garrison at Laboiselle entirely surrounded has surrendered. The Allies have advanced to higher ground. The famous French General Foch is commanding the operations on the somme which increases confidence in the Allied offensive. Germany admits the recent disaster. The enemy are fiercely resisting the French bombardment on the Meuse.

Later reports say that the enemy fighting furiously have retaken a portion of Laboiselle, but the British advance over a wide front has swept up 12,000 prisoners and many guns. The French have already advanced six miles.

Steady Advance

Paris, July 4.—The third day of the Somme battle shows steady advance and capture of many prisoners and munitions. The enemy is weakening on account of the Allies being within three miles of the important railway junction of Peronne, regarded as the strongest German position.

8,000 Captives

The French have captured Chapelle wood, Feuilles, Asseville, and second line German trenches at Estrees, also the villages of Herbecourt, Buscourt and Flaucourt with eight thousand prisoners and considerable artillery.

Local Trouble Cut off Chance to
Land the Fish in Prince
Rupert

All the waterfront fish houses were bustling with activity yesterday. The purchases of the previous day were being packed and loaded in to cars for shipment to the East.

There were a few additional arrivals, whose catches sold at the current rate of six cents a pound. The American schooner Republic arrived in the morning with 30,000 lbs., but Captain Hegge decided not to accept the six cent rate and he proceeded to Seattle, where his ship is to undergo some repairs. The Cold Storage Company's schooner Chief Zibassa, Captain Jacobson, arrived at noon with 60,000 pounds.

The heavy halibut receipts of the past few days is attributed to the fact that the fishermen timed their arrival for the first of the month so that they might get back to Ketichikan in time for the Fourth of July celebration. There will thus be a quiet period for a week or two following the holiday.

The Cold Storage boats left last evening for the south to sell their catches in consequence of the temporary trouble at the local plant.

Heaviest Trains On Record Pulled Out Of Prince Rupert

It is said that the G.T.P. plying out of Prince Rupert has the heaviest trains that are operated on any of the lines. The railway takes out quite regularly fifteen cars. On the outward trip these are loaded cars. As many as six refrigerator cars of fish go out attached to the regular train, making this the longest that is handled by a single locomotive. The train is taken care of all along the line with but one locomotive attached which is a proof that the road bed of the railway is unexcelled.

The tourist travel is in reality only beginning now in real earnest. This morning there will be three sleepers of the standard type used by the G.T.P. The accommodation in these cars it is said is practically all taken.

Travel by the steamers of the company is also very heavy. For the next two months there is assurance that the space will be all taken up on the Alaskan runs. This applies likewise to the other steamers beside the G.T.P.

SEA LION LIFE BEING INVESTIGATED

MEMBERS OF SPECIAL COMMISSION ARE IN THE CITY IN CONNECTION WITH WORK

The Habits of the Animal is Being Studied by the Members

The members of the special commission that was appointed last year to investigate the Sea Lion question as it affects this coast is in the city. This commission is different to the general commission, as it travels with little or no ostentation and does its work quietly. The body is composed of Dr. C. F. Newcombe and Dr. C. McLennan Fraser, F.R.C.S., with W. H. Greenwood, as secretary of the body. The fact that the body has as its secretary an old news paper man, may in large measure account for the fact that its work is being carried out so quietly and well.

The idea of the commission is to ascertain whether there is any reason for preserving the sea lions or whether these animals might with advantage be slaughtered off, being a menace to the fishing industry. There are reasons advanced along both lines and the Government felt that it was wise to take the precautions before waging a proposed war on these animals to investigate the claim made on behalf of the sea lion that it was serving a useful purpose (Continued on Page Four.)

MET BOARD OF TRADE YESTESDAY

FISHERIES QUESTIONS TAKEN
UP WITH H. S. CLEMENTS,

The Fishery Committee of the Board of Trade and others met H. S. Clements, M.P., yesterday afternoon in the Board rooms. The object of the gathering was to consider the questions that affect the fishing industry on the coast and more especially those affecting this city.

The subjects were taken up and freely discussed. At this time when these matters are before the public it is considered as inexpedient to give the fullest publicity to the lines of argument adopted, but Mr. Clements expressed his readiness at all times to take any request that might be made of him in the matter by the citizens of Prince Rupert and press for these. Mr. Clements has great faith in the future of this city as a fish centre and believes that nothing can upset it in the place it has won.

Government Has Made Special Grant To Hospital This Year

The City Hospital is to be assisted this year again by a special grant from the Provincial Government. This welcome news for the Board of Directors and the city generally has been received from the office of the Provincial Secretary at Victoria, which office is in charge of this part of the public service. The grant that is to be made this year will be \$1,500. In the making of this grant the chairman and members of the Board are to be heartily congratulated upon the good work that has followed their efforts.

Last year when the grant was made it was intimated that there was little or no likelihood of any further assistance being obtained for the institution but that it would have to rely upon the general grants under the act and upon the city assistance.

The president of the institution and the directors were not to be lightly turned aside in this matter and accordingly started in earnest early in the year to get the added assistance. In Hon. Wm. Manson the hospital has had a very warm friend and his active sympathy was enlisted with the results that have come.

The letter that has been received from the department covering the matter is as follows:

Victoria, June 28th, 1916

Sir,—Referring to your request for the Prince Rupert General Hospital, I am directed by the Honourable the Provincial Secretary to inform you that the matter has received his most careful consideration and, as a result, and having regard to the amount set aside in the estimates for this purpose, it has been decided to allow you the sum of \$1,500 as a special grant. A cheque for this sum will reach you in the course of a few days.

This grant with the vote that has been made by the city of \$5,000, places the hospital in fair shape for the present season.

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the right applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

NIGERIA TO SELL GERMAN HOLDINGS

There Will be a Sale of Former Possessions of the Kaiser

Sells, Limited, of London, has been instructed by government authority in Nigeria, to announce the sale on October 31 next of property good will and trade marks of German and Austrian firms in that colony, the announcement appearing in the advertisement columns of papers.

The British Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria comprises what was prior to January 1, 1914, two separate administrative units—Northern Nigeria and Southern Nigeria.

Nigeria has a seaboard of 450 miles, extending from the Dahomian border, on the west, to the Cameroons, on the east. The principal ports on this coast line are Lagos, the largest town and most important seaport commercially on the west coast of Africa; Forcados, situated at the mouth of Forcados river, the principal port for stations on Niger River, Warri, Sapele, Brass, Degema, Port Harcourt, a new and very important port, the sea terminus of the Eastern Railway; Bonny, Opobo and Calabar. Ocean going steam vessels with a draught of up to 20 feet can enter the natural harbors of Forcados, Bonny and Calabar, and now, with the great improvements which have taken place in the harbor of Lagos, vessels drawing up to 19 feet 6 inches can enter that port and anchor in the spacious harbor.

The area of Nigeria, which extends from the Sahara to the sea, is approximately 335,700 square miles, and the population is estimated at 16,258,000 natives and 100,000 Europeans.

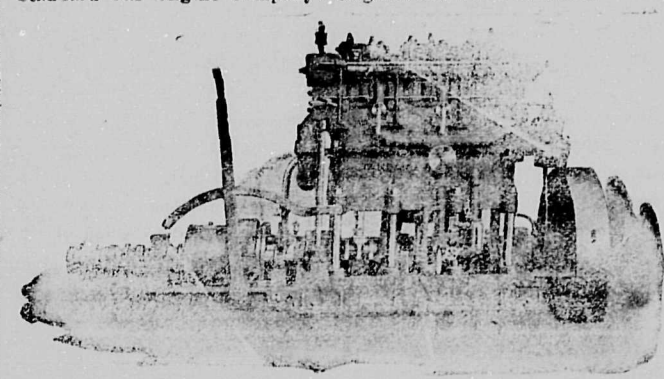
