#### Russian Advance Is At Rate Of Over Five Miles A Day

#### MEMBERS RAILWAY COMMISSION HERE

SIR HENRY DRAYTON AND A. S. GOODEVE WENT SOUTH YESTERDAY

They Arrived Here By Special Train Sunday After-noon.

On Sunday afternoon, by special train from the east, there arrived in the city members of the Canadian Railway Commission who are on their way to Vancouver to attend the sitting there of that body. There was on board the chairman of that body, Sir Henry Drayton, who is accompanied by Lady Drayton and Miss Drayton; A. S. Goodeve, a second member of the Commission; R. Richardson, the Secretary; C. M. B. Chapman Association Secretary; and Nelson R. Butcher, the official reporter.

The trip over the G. T. P. was the first one taken by the members. They travelled by day only, so as to get the opportunity of inspecting the road. They were well pleased with the character of the roadbed.

Sir Henry himself expressed his surprise at the fine townsite, after leaving the rather forbidding view on entering.

#### PREMIER BOWSER IS WELL RECEIVED

MEETINGS WERE HELD AT HAZELTON AND TERRACE

The Premier Was Given A Stirring Reception As He Dealt With Issues Of Past Session

Hazelton, June 19.—Turning eastward towards the great hinterland of British Columbia, Premier Bowser and his party today ascended the easy grades of the Grand Trunk Pacific to Terrace and Hazelton.

Striking evidence of what progress may be attained even in a new farming section is shown at Terrace, and it was with pleasure that the new Minister of Agriculture, Hon. William Manson, noted the strides which have been made since his first visit in this section of the constituency which he represents.

He explained at some length, at a public meeting here today, the workings of the new Agricultural Credits Act, and the provisions for loans to settlers, and was received with applause and approval by the members of this agricultural community, who assembled in large number in the public hall to hear the speeches.

H. B. Thompson gave a talk full of homely wisdom upon the need of co-operation, and gave information as to selling agencies and the need of fostering a community spirit.

The Premier, Hon. W. J. Bowser, was given a stirring reception, and dealt at length with the issues of the past session of the Legislature. On the conclusion of his address he was felicitated upon his assuming the leadership of the party and assured that Terrace would give his cordial support.

#### Austrians Suffer At Hands Of Italians In Recent Fighting

Rome, June 19.—The Austrians are maintaining their original plan of pressing an offensive at Tentino. They have not withdrawn the troops. The result is that the Russian offensive has been such that withdrawal has become more difficult, because of the counter offensive the Italians are now maintaining. Further Austrian attacks have been repulsed.

In Frenzale and Sugana sectors the Italians made further progress.

#### TO START ROCK CRUSHER AND IMPROVE STREETS

Mayor Authorized To Have The Work Started Near City Hall.

At the council meeting last evening the council authorized the Mayor to get the rock crusher started, and some repairing of the streets carried out with the crushed rock. It is proposed to excavate some rock next to the City Hall, there being a bylaw authorizing that still in effect.

#### ROCHER DE BOULE IS BUSY CAMP

D. J. WILLIAMS, THE SUPERINTENDENT, SAYS THE COMPANY IS INCREASING FORCE

Many Are In The Hill Prospecting At This Time.

D. J. Williams, Superintendent of the Rocher de Boule mine, is in the city at present. He says the high price of copper is proving an incentive to increase the output of the mine as much as possible. With the object in view, the number of men will be increased. As a further incentive to this, the company has increased the pay of the men, which is now equal to that paid at Anyox, being \$4.50 a day for miners.

Mr. Williams is well satisfied with the outlook at the works, and will keep up regular shipments to the south.

#### GERMAN ATTACKS HAVE BEEN REPULSED BY THE FRENCH

Paris, June 19.—The German infantry attack on the French position north of Hill 321 has been repulsed by a French battery. The Germans are continuing their bombardment at Deadman's Hill in the Chattanooga region.

#### VON MOLTKE OF GERMAN ARMY STAFF IS DEAD

Amsterdam, June 19.—Lieut.-General Count Hellmuth Von Moltke, Chief of the German Supplementary Staff of the army, died of heart apoplexy during the morning service in the Reichstag for the late Field Marshal Von Der Goltz, who met his death at the hands of the Turks.

#### FISH SELLING AT OVER NINE CENTS

HALIBUT IS BRINGING A GOOD PRICE ON THE LOCAL EXCHANGE

Spring Salmon Is Likewise Selling At A Good Rate.

The price of halibut is still going up, and it is now within a few notches of the record price reached here last April. On Sunday N. C. Nunan, of the Atlin Fisheries, paid 9 3-4 cents a pound for 9,000 pounds, landed by the American schooner Niagara. Yesterday the Pacific Fisheries took the Soya 8,000 and the Nautilus 7,000 pounds at 9 3-8 cents, while the Cold Storage Company took the Director 10,000 and Star 14,000 at 9 1-4 cents.

The Geo. E. Foster, of the Cold Storage fleet, arrived on Sunday with 40,000 pounds, and the Zorra, of the Atlin Fisheries with 12,000.

Spring Salmon continues to sell at 7 1-2 cents. Capt. Henry Edenshaw, of Massett, sold 24,000 pounds to the Pacific Fisheries yesterday at that figure.

## SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory in tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns shall be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

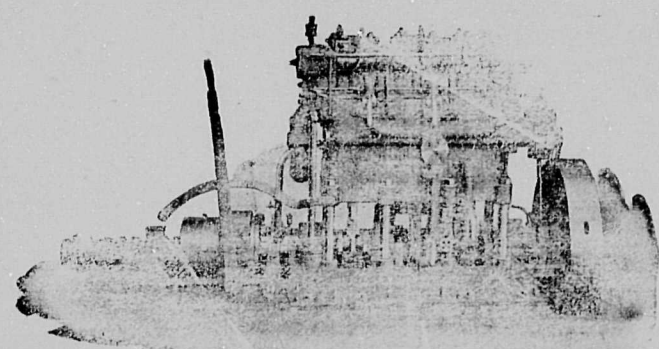
