## THE TOLL OF WAR.

Yesterday the city had a gloom cast over it again upon the news being received that Lieut. Adair Carss had met his death in action. This young officer was known to practically everyone in the city. He was respected and esteemed by all. To his father, Police Magistrate Carss and Mrs. Carss, the deepest sympathy will go out. This city, in common with every centre in the Empire, is being repeatedly thrown into gloom in consequence of the death of most worthy citizens. Death in a cause such as these men are offering their lives is a glorious one. Nevertheless, to the relatives and friends the taking off comes with the same poignancy as it would under less heroic circumstances. The nation is giving of its brightest and its best to block the aggressive move of Germany. The work of stopping the Hun must be accomplished, but on occasions like this we are forced to realize that it is being done at tremendous sacrifice.

## THE WAR LOANS.

The Dominion Government is advertising the war issues for the information of those wishing to invest. In connection with the subject of war loans the Bank of Commerce in its monthly commercial letter says:

Of far greater significance than the mere amount of the subscription to the September loan of \$100,000,000 is the evidence thus furnished of the national determination to supply money as well as men to carry on the war until a satisfactory peace is assured. Although the aggregate of the subscriptions has not yet been officially announced, it is known to be in excess of twice the amount called for. This gratifying result, to which all classes freely contributed, cannot fail to lend encouragement to the cause of the Allies.

With the proceeds of the loan the Minister of Finance will be able to provide for the requirements of the country, and for Treasury notes amounting to \$32,000,000 which mature November 1st and December 1, as well as to lend to the Imperial Government for munitions purchased in Canada, \$25,000,000 in November and \$25,000,000 in December. As this latter operation will necessitate further borrowing later on, the banks have arranged to advance to the Dominion Government \$25,000,000 in January and a further \$25,000,000 in February against four months' Treasury Bills. During September approximately \$112,000,000 of the amount advanced by the Imperial authorities for war purposes was funded and forms part of the collateral for the recent loan obtained in New York.

The chief factors in placing the affairs of the nation in a favorable position at so critical a time are the continued expansion of our foreign trade and higher prices for our chief products. The ability of the country to keep on financing its own requirements, and, at the same time, to lend money to the Imperial Munitions Board depends upon the continuance of munition orders, and upon the exercise of the strictest economy in every direction by the people as a whole.

## SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant.

Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only; but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 per acre.

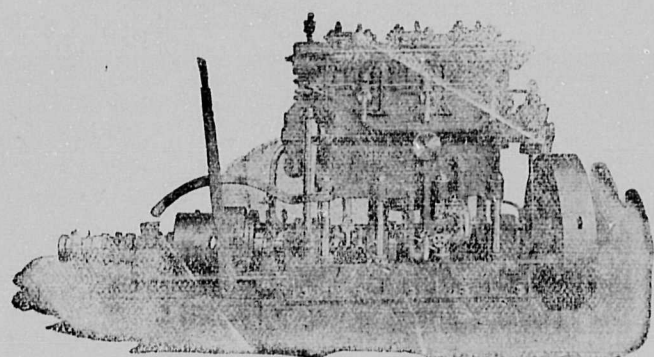
