Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Teritory, the Nothwest Teritories and a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twentyone years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant.

Aplications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the dis-trict in which the rights applied for

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the mer-chantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.




